Arrests Made in Bushnell Man's Death

Illinois State Police (ISP) Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) Zone 4 announce the arrest of 18-year-old Davin M. Purden for First Degree Murder (Class M Felony); and 17-year-old Nicholas C. Lafary for First Degree Murder (Class M Felony), both of Bushnell.

On June 2, 2023, ISP DCI agents were requested to conduct a death investigation in the 600 block of Osbourne

Street in Bushnell. During the investigation, 43-year-old Travis Purden was discovered deceased in his residence with multiple gunshot

wounds. After a thorough and extensive investigation, including reviewing surveillance camera footage and conducting interviews, D. Purden and Lafary were identified as suspects.

On June 4, 2023, arrest warrants were issued for D. Purden and Lafary, and on June 5, 2023, ISP took Purden and Lafary into custody. They were lodged in the McDonough County

Alumnus Donates Plant and Crop Measurement Equipment to WIU School of Agriculture

MACOMB - A Western Illinois University Distinguished Alumnus has made an equipment donation to the School of Agriculture, which will help students with the use of technology in the field.

Mike Thurow received his bachelor's degree from WIU in Agricultural Engineering-Mechanization with Honors in 1973. He then received his MBA from the Keller Graduate School of Management in 1985.

Thurow recently donated a long list of technological equipment to the University to help show students how plants and crops are performing in University fields. The donation is on behalf of his company, Spectrum Technologies, Inc. in Aurora, IL.

"The assumption is that professors will share the value of measurement technology and the data gathered in their classes," said Thurow. "Also, the vision is that students will use the various meters, sensors and weather stations in their labs and see first-hand the



value of measurement data and the correlation with crop quality and yield."

WIU School of Agriculture Director Andy Baker said the donated equipment will greatly enhance the department's current and future research programming.

"It will also greatly benefit us when writing grant proposals that will

utilize Spectrum's technology that will capture accurate field and greenhouse data," Baker said. "We are very pleased and excited to be able to use the latest and greatest technology in the industry today for our course labs and research programs, plus the development of undergraduate research projects."

Thurow developed his vision for the measurement and data equipment 40 years ago while working with crop production equipment for the International Harvester Company. While he was in graduate school, he created a business plan to develop and market







Jail. Purden was given a \$2,000,000 bond, 10% to apply. Lafary was charged as an adult and also given a \$2,000,000 bond, 10% to apply. ISP also took 37-year-old Patricia J. Purden of Bushnell, and a 17-year-old juvenile female into custody for Obstructing Justice (Class 4), awaiting a bond hearing.

No further information will be released at this time. This is an active and ongoing investigation.

All subjects are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.







GOOD GROWING

Is it too late to cut back ornamental grasses?

Every day I drive up to my house I am confronted with the neglect of my landscape. Admittedly, I did not cut back my ornamental grasses this spring. At a Memorial Day pool party, the conversation turned to neighbors who don't cut back their grasses. Everyone agreed, uncut ornamental grasses drove them crazy! I slunk low in my patio chair and shot my wife a glance that read, "Don't give me away!"

Why do unpruned ornamental grasses stick in my conscience so much? It's only a couple of grasses, right? Well, the former owner of our home must have loved ornamental grasses, because they are everywhere in my yard. No matter where you look right now, there are half-green, half-tan clumps of tall

I did a better job managing these grasses for the few previous springs we have been in our home. One year I borrowed a friend's hedge trimmer, tied the grasses in a bundle, and cut

at the base of the plant. The bundle is easy to carry and makes cleanup a breeze. The next year I burned all the grass. That was much more exciting, but if you've never burned prairie or grasses before, these fires burn quickly and intensely. I may have accidentally scorched part of the neighbor's lawn. (I apologized!) What's the hang-up this year? These last months, I find myself either at the office or the baseball field helping coach two little league teams. The grasses will have to wait.

So what happens to the grass if we don't cut it back in the spring? Nothing. It does not affect the overall health of the grass. Actually, once the new green leaf blades grow up they will mask last year's foliage. Aside from the brown seed heads poking over the green growth, you won't even notice.


Leaving ornamental grasses standing over the winter does help protect the growing points of the plant at the soil line from extremely cold temperatures. Grasses and other herbaceous plant stems also serve as habitat for beneficial insects and pollinators.

You may even argue that it is okay to just leave old growth every year. However, the accumulation of dead grass material can cause longer-term problems. And removing that old growth can be useful in getting rid of the debris and mimicking fire that created the vast North American prairies where many of our ornamental grasses developed.

At this point in early June do I plan to do anything with my ornamental grasses? I may take scissors and remove the most offending seed heads from last year. I also have plans to dig up some of the grasses and replace them with some woody shrubs and perennials. Cutting them back now at this point is probably not in the cards as they are just getting out of their ugly duckling phase and it would just prolong that.

While I may hang my head somewhat in guilt for not cutting back my ornamental grasses, I remember sometimes the imperfections give us a new perspective. As Yogi Berra said, "If the world were perfect, it wouldn't be."

Good Growing Tip of the Week: Cutting or burning your ornamental grasses in the spring does have a benefit. When foliage is removed, spring growth will begin earlier. Old foliage left on the plant can delay the crown's warming and subsequent growth by as much as 3 weeks.



plant measurement technology for the agricultural and horticulture industry. This resulted in his opening of Spectrum Technologies, Inc. in 1987; a company which has grown into a world leader in advanced plant measuring technology.

"There were no companies doing this at the time," Thurow said. "Our first product at Spectrum was a Soil pH Meter, and many other products followed. Today, a product development team of engineers and software developers at Spectrum create the products, Cloud solutions and apps that bring more value to measurement data.'

Thurow's company has 45 employees and has developed 25 products, which have been named AE50 award winners by the American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers for outstanding product innovation.

Spectrum Technologies, Inc. does business all over the world.

WIU's School of Agriculture has previously ordered equipment from Thurow's company. After meeting with researchers from WIU, Thurow said he decided he wanted to "help these passionate folks enhance their research work with plant measurement technology."

'The need to measure key environmental parameters is relevant to understanding how plants and crops perform, and the yield that's produced," he said. "One of my favorite sayings is that 'we know what we know, but we don't know what we don't know.' Measurement data explains most of these factors and variables that Mother Nature delivers."

Thurow said his experience at WIU was significant in the process of validating his passion for mechanized agriculture. He said he graduated from Western with the confidence that he could achieve anything in life he desired.

"I was motivated to becoming a better student by professors (Ed) Breece, (Safwat) Moustafa and (Bill) Detar, with their support for learning and achievement," he said. "I was active in the Ag Mech Club and the trade show that introduced graduates to career opportunities with the various exhibiting companies. I have great memories of being an officer and soliciting companies in the area to exhibit at the show."

Thurow and his wife, Donna, live in Naperville, IL. They have three daughters and three grandchildren. He was named one of the School of Agriculture's Distinguished Alumni in March during Farm Expo weekend at Western.
