Hancock County Fights Cancer

Teams for Hancock County Fights Cancer are ready for the 2023 HCFC Block Party on Saturday, June 1, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Hancock County Courthouse lawn.

The block party celebrates cancer survivors and current patients, and unites the community to raise money for cancer research and to help local people being treated for cancer.

Last year the event raised over \$40,000. Again this year, proceeds will be split with 60 percent going to HUGS of Hancock County and 40 percent going to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

Cancer survivors are invited check in between 11 a.m. and 12 noon to be part of the 12:30 p.m. ceremony honoring survivors.

This year's event joins the Strawberry Strut on the square that same morning. Following Strawberry Strut awards at around 10:30 a.m. HCFC pre-party events begin. There will be stories about Hancock County survivors, entertainment by JoAnn Dierk's

piano students, and announcements about coming events.

The car show set up begins at 11 a.m. lining both sides of Wabash Street on the south side of the square, with the

street closed for safe, easy viewing of the cars.

Car show prizes are given in many categories. Winners are chosen by visitors who vote with money in their jars. All funds collected go to Hancock County Fights Cancer.

The event opens at 11:15 a.m. with welcoming comments by HCFC and HUGS, the Pledge of Allegiance led by young children from the area, the National Anthem sung by Christine Murphy and prayer by Pastor

"Just Another Band" featuring Carl Thomas will provide entertainment at 11:30 a.m.
