King Neptune Performs Piedmont Blues at New Copperfield's Book Service

King Neptune studied music in the classical tradition, but when he heard the music from the early 20th Century, the Golden Age of Blues, "the music was so free compared to the rigidity of the classical repertoire that I had to learn it." Not finding sheet music for guitar, he used his Classical training to create his own.

"My whole life I've been playing music." It's a journey that has taken him from coast to coast across the United States as well as to Europe. But it was Piedmont Blues that kept calling him back. "That's the stuff I like. I mean, that's what does it for me."

The free performances at New Copperfield's Book Service give all area music lovers an opportunity to hear the finest local musicians in live performance in an intimate, family-friendly atmosphere on a Saturday afternoon. The event is free and everyone is invited.

University of Illinois Springfield TFSE launches Artist in Residence program

LEWISTOWN, Ill. - The University of Illinois Springfield's Therkildsen Field Station at Emiquon (TFSE) is launching a new Artist in Residence (AIR) program this summer to connect the science of floodplain restoration with artistic expression.

The program invites artists to engage with the unique landscape and ecological work at the Emiquon Preserve—one of the Midwest's largest floodplain restoration projects and a designated Ramsar Wetland of International Importance. Selected artists will have access to the preserve, TFSE facilities and outdoor spaces to pursue a creative project inspired by the site.

The goal of the AIR program is to foster a community of artists while providing space to interpret and reflect on the Emiquon Preserve through diverse artistic genres. Artists will be required to learn about the history and science of the site, interact with See TFSE on page 9




