Auditions set for *Wizard of Oz* production at The Legacy Theater

Auditions for the Missoula Children's Theatre production of The Wizard of Oz at The Legacy Theater in Carthage, will be held on Monday, Jan. 27, from 4 to 6 p.m.

Performances will be held on Saturday, Feb. 1, at 2 and 6 p.m. at The Legacy Theater.

There are roles for students in kindergarten through twelfth grade. Approximately 50 local students will be cast to appear in the show. Up to four students will be cast as assistant directors. There is no guarantee that everyone who auditions will be cast in the play.

Students wishing to audition must arrive by the 4 p.m. starting time and stay for the entire two-hour session. The first rehearsal begins approximately 15 minutes after the audition.

This is a group audition. No advance preparation is necessary. Students should be ready to come and have a good time.

Rehearsals will continue in two sessions each day between 4 to 8:15 p.m. at The Legacy Theater, Tuesday through Friday, Jan. 28 to 31. A detailed rehearsal schedule will be distrib-



uted at the conclusion of the audition.

Although not all cast members will be needed at every session, students who audition must have a clear schedule for the entire week and if selected, be able to attend all rehearsals required for their role and be available for all scheduled performances.

Denim for Dollars employee campaign

The latest recipients of the Spoon River College Denim for Dollars employee campaign for 2024 were Fulton-Mason Crisis Service, Girls Unplugged, and the Spoon River College Foundation (hardship funds and food pantry), with each receiving \$283.31.

The college created the Denim for Dollars campaign in 2023, allowing employees to wear jeans throughout the work week for a \$25 donation every six months. The money is then divided and distributed to different organizations twice a year. During July through December, \$850 was raised, and a total of \$2,475 was raised for the entire year.

Regular recipients are Girls Unplugged, SRC Foundation, Fulton-Mason Crisis Service, and WIRC-CAA Victim Services, and employees have the option of nominating other charities or organizations to also receive a percentage. Past recipients that have been nominated and received funds are The Canton Learning Collaborative, Linda's Fund, Humane Society of McDonough County, Cuba Food Pantry, The Good Pantry, and W.D. Boyce Council (Boy Scouts of America).

Girls Unplugged is a free community-led after school group for 5th through 8th grade girls at Ingersoll Middle School and is sponsored by Canton Park District, MidAmerica National Bank, Spoon River College, and YWCA of Canton.

SRC Offers Cannabis Horticulture Class


Macomb – The Spoon River College Office of Community Outreach is offering a class called Cannabis Horticulture this Spring. This affordable 12-week program prepares students for a career in the quickly growing Cannabis Industry. Classes begin on Wednesday, January 22.

Cannabis Horticulture will cover the basic botany of the cannabis plant, soil science, fertigation, integrated pest management and cannabinoid testing. Students will receive

training online but will also receive hands on experience through lab exercises.

This class is being presented by Thomas Vogel, SRC biology faculty member whose area of expertise is plant anatomy and physiology, propagation, genetics and evolution, Cannabis sativa and science education.

Class will meet in person on Wednesdays, January 22 – April 23 from 2:30-6:30pm. The course will also meet on March 5 from 3-5pm, April 9 from 3-5pm, and May 2 from 1-3pm
