# Honoring CFA and Melvin Foote for 5 Years of Service

Mr. Melvin P. Foote is a pioneer in the field of African Affairs. He has over 35 years of experience and has worked in over 30 African countries; he is recognized as a leading expert on issues related to African policies and programs.

Mr. Foote founded the **Constituency for Africa (CFA)** in 1990, in order to establish a network of organizations, groups and individuals committed to the progress and empowerment of Africa and African people worldwide. CFA's mission is to build public and private support for Africa, and to help shape a progressive U.S. policy towards Africa.

Mr. Foote is also the founder of a dynamic CFA-related program called the African American Unity Caucus (AAUC). The AAUC is a broad-based coalition of African-American and African leaders of Africa-focused organizations and groups, to promote pan-Africanism and to link Diaspora leaders in the Western Hemisphere with the African Union (AU), the coordinating forum of the nations of Africa. Further, Mr. Foote serves as an advisor to the African Union's Ambassador to Washington and as a consultant to the World Bank on African Diaspora issues.


Mr. Foote is the recipient of numerous awards and recognitions that include the "Order of the Lion" Award in 1998, which is the highest public service honor of the Government of Senegal, and the Congressional Black Caucus 2001 Annual Legislative Conference's Diggs Award for Foreign Affairs in recognition of his outstanding commitment and achievement on issues and concerns pertaining to Africa.

Today we honor and thank the Constituency for Africa (CFA), Melvin Foote and Jeannine B. Scott for their dedication to the Day of Resilience.

Mr. Melvin Foote has been central to the success of the Day of Resilience since its inception. The Harriet Tubman Town Halls, hosted by the CFA bring together committed communities and individuals to look at topics critical to empowering African people worldwide.

Mr. Foote has introduced Cambridge to Ambassadors from African nations during the Day of Resilience. Taking it one step further, he introduces and promotes Cambridge to the world. Wherever he goes, his support for Cambridge shows. We would like to thank Melvin Foote, and CFA for their service to our community.






# Alpha Genesis CDC

## Planning for the Future

Renovations are beginning soon at the Headquarters Building at 428 Race St. AGCDC has several goals for the renovation and historic preservation of this building. First, to protect and steward this important location in Downtown Cambridge. Working in partnership with the City, the connection from Cannery Way to the Take My Hand mural will become more accessible to our community and visitors. ADA access is on the top of the list, as is upgrading the paved area in front of the mural, and the connected parking lot.

Next, the project will activate this underutilized space next to Cannery Park. The second floor of the building has been abandoned for decades, and did not even have access within the property! Look for Non-Profit incubator and office space, including a physical location for Alpha Genesis. With this location, Alpha Genesis can grow their outreach and development programs. Even more exciting, the first floor retail spaces will get much needed stabilization and rehab work completed. In addition, 2 more units, accessed from the side and rear of the building will enable start-up businesses to get off the ground in the Downtown Arts and Entertainment district. We hope to showcase the variety and engagement that new entrepreneurs can bring to the Cambridge, while helping to create opportunity for economic development and new jobs downtown.

Finally, the building will host more programming and engagement, both within Cambridge and as a cultural tourism destination point. Big ideas are just around the corner as we continue to strive for empowerment and unity, holding events that promote growth and understanding through arts and culture.

Learning to think out of the box, they will participate in entrepreneurship coursework, as well a learning the behind the scenes work of running a business.

The other "Scoop" on Minty's Ice Cream Treats & More is building community connections. Each month Minty's will highlight a community organization. Featured organizations can connect with the store's interns, sharing how the organization works to meet community needs and aspirations. 
