

Record Clamp Collet Hole Enlargement

Some turntable brands were manufactured with slightly oversize record spindles causing difficulty installing and removing the Michell record clamp. There is a simple solution that will solve this problem.

Items Required

- 1. ¼" diameter hardwood dowel available at most craft stores, hobby shops or hardware stores.
- 2. Hacksaw
- 3. 320 grit Wet-or-Dry sandpaper
- 4. Electric drill (variable speed drill preferred)

Procedure

- 1. First cut the dowel down to a length of 4 to 6 inches.
- 2. Using a hacksaw cut a slot into one end of the dowel to a depth of about 1 1/2 inches
- 3. Cut a strip of 320 grit sandpaper about 1" wide by 1 " long
- 4. Install the sandpaper in the slot and roll it tightly against the dowel with grit side outwards
- 5. Unscrew the knob from the clamp being careful not to lose the white Teflon interface washer.
- 6. Install the dowel into an electric drill and insert the rolled up sandpaper into the hole in the collet
- 7. Turn on the drill using the lowest speed and gradually increase to a comfortable speed while moving the collet back and forth.
- 8. Keep testing the collet on the record spindle until it slides on comfortably.
- 9. Clean the collet with lighter fluid or WD 40 to remove any grit and reassemble the clamp.
