ABOUT US

Sakhe Family Care is a nonprofit organization situated at one of the small towns of the Kouga municipality called Humansdorp. The organization was established in 2015 by Thanduxolo Buka, with the vision of preserving the family system through the promotion of fatherhood, healthy parenting, self-development and economic independence.

The organization offers family preservation and victim empowerment programs that are both preventative and remedial in nature. Sakhe Family Care prioritizes **healthy relationship-building** amongst families and **economic growth** in poverty stricken areas, as they are key catalysts in alleviating the scourge of poverty; improving the quality and protection of family life and creating safer communities.

The organization's sustainability and effectiveness in implementing its programs for its beneficiaries has been fueled by its competent personnel, supportive community, relevant stakeholders and funding partners. Sakhe is greatly indebted to the Department of Social Development, Kouga municipality, Kouga Health Department, Correctional Services, the Kouga Wind farm, the Humansdorp Woodlands Dairy, the IDT, the NDA, BopheloImpilo Development Centre, and the KwaNomzamo community for supporting its vision and making it a reality.

Sakhe Family Care has reached out to more than 1850 families; mentored 210 young men in preparation for manhood; Awarded 140 men as Fathers and Man of Honor; helped over 3000 learners through the After School program; Created over 150 Jobs; and conducted over 50 workshops on parenting, fatherhood, small scale farming, and Gender-based violence. The organization continues to make strides to extend its reach and transform the lives of many in the Kouga municipality and surrounding areas of the Sarah Baartman district.





VISION

Building sustainable and quality family life, through psychosocial programs, educational support and promotion of economic independence, for families to function at their optimal level.



MISION

We prioritize the equipment of families with effective tools and parenting skills to activate and enable healthy marriage life and parent-child relationships.

We strive towards being a safe developmental space where participants could freely express their hopes and pursue their dreams.

We are committed to providing support for unemployed parents by empowering them with skills, linking them to job opportunities and encouraging economic independence.

OBJECTIVES

1. Recruit 40 Grade 3 – 6 learners into the After School Program annually, to assist with homework, extra syllabus lessons, and keep them invested in academic activities that would enable them to reach higher learning in future.

- 7. Equip 30 women with sewing skills and produce one legally registered enterprise that will commercialise the learned skill.
- 2. Equip 240 Families with skills that would enrich their relationships, and enable them towards good parenting practices, economic stability and selfdevelopment every fiscal year.
- 6. Train 120 beneficiaries with small scale farming skills by the end of 2021

 Harness funding opportunities that will ensure full implementation of all our projects and quality service delivery for our beneficiaries without fail.

5. Create 120 Job opportunities in the next 3 years, and retain 50% of continued permanent employment.

4. Ensure organizational sustainability, through income generating projects.

Developmental Programs

1. After School Program

The program focuses on providing after school homework, extra lessons and test/Exam preparation, for pupils in Grade 3 and Grade 4. The objective is to help children coming from Impoverished backgrounds to receive sufficient nutritional and educational support.

2. Job Readiness Program

This program is designed for out of school unemployed youth. Activities include; Self-development life skills, Career Guidance, Leadership Skills, Learnerships and Job creation through Expanded Public Works and infrastructure programs. The objective is to create a safe space for the youth to unleash and discover their Godly given talents and gifts.

Livelihood Program 1. Small Scale Farming

One hundred and twenty Job opportunities have been created through this project from 2019 to date. The main aim of the program is to increase the number of households that grow their own food and influence entrepreneurial skills that will turn this activity into a business opportunity.

Sewing Skills Training

A new skills and enterprise development program that is aimed at equipping 30 women annually with sewing and business skills. This is designed to assist GBV victims and survivors, to find own ways of survival and become economically independent.
