UPLIFT OUR YOUTH CAMPAIGN SUCCESS!

WITH COVID-19, YSF HAD TO GET CREATIVE FOR THE SPRING FUNDRAISER

When Covid-19 began to appear in Washington State, the Foundation was in the final stages of planning for the spring fundraiser, Celebrate Our Youth. Invitations had been sent, sponsors secured, and all logistics were falling into place. Once the virus made its way to Yakima, the Celebrate Our Youth Committee began making additional plans to implement safety and sanitation measures for the event to go on as usual. Then, when Governor Inslee implemented the "stay at home order," everything changed. The Committee knew we would have to postpone and eventually canceled the event. However, this quick thinking and creative group decided to embark on an ambitious journey to raise \$30,000 in 30 days for the month of April. The Committee not only knew they needed to seek funds for lost revenue from the Celebrate Our Youth event but was determined to raise additional funds to support the Teacher Grant Program. With this idea in mind, the "Uplift Our Youth" campaign was created. This campaign was two tiered with a strong social media component and an appeal letter sent through the mail. Each day on Facebook, a new video was uploaded featuring sponsors, Board Members, community supporters, and even local celebrities, to share why they support the Foundation and to encourage others to do so as well. Because of sponsors, generous donors, and community partners, we were able to raise over \$21,000 in our 30 day campaign.

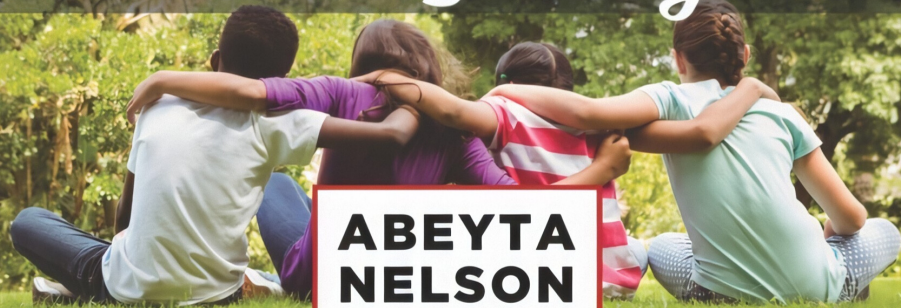

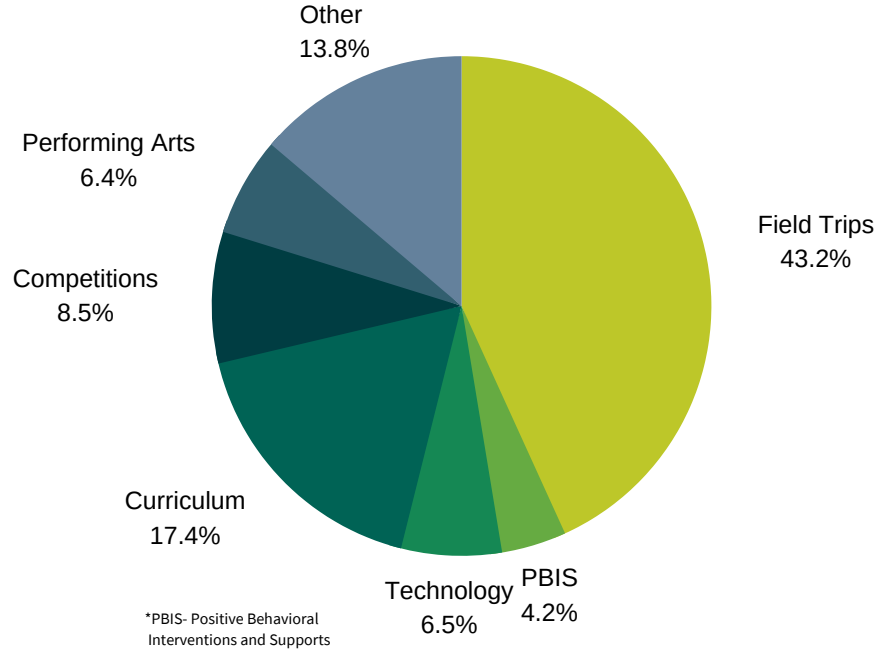
