Washington Middle School Mentorship Program

Lions: AIM (Achievement In Motion)

This past school year Yakima Schools Foundation partnered with Washington Middle School to create and launch a mentorship program, Lions: AIM (Achievement In Motion). In its pilot year the program supported 45 students. The program's mentors consisted of community members throughout Yakima who committed to a yearlong commitment to the program and their mentee. A training was conducted to all mentors, going over basic information, need to know information, and provide them with resources to support their yearlong mentorship.

Coming back into school and the classroom after a pandemic that has lasted over a year was full of challenges. The program helped students who were unengaged and/or showed the need for support to help ease the transition back into school and the classroom. Over the course of the year the group participated in monthly experiences together from visiting Central Washington University to attending Yakima Town Hall.

Partnerships with caring adults and positive role models have proven to be very beneficial to them. Thank you to our 45 mentors for volunteering to support our students!
