Artist as Muse

Taking their creative counterparts as inspiration, the photographers featured here turn artists into subjects. The images encapsulate both the photographer's signature style and the subject's public persona. Richard Avedon's dramatic visual sensibility is emphasized in his powerfully gritty portrait of film director John Ford. Yousuf Karsh's chiaroscuro portrait of the famed modern composer Jean Sebilus renders a deeply furrowed brow, denoting an embodiment of music akin to the markings on a score. Lewis Morley snapped the brash Young British Artist Sarah Lucas at the height of her emergence, and her seated position atop a toilet, back facing the viewer, seems an apropos representation of her personal and professional style. In contrast, Reed Massengill's colorful portrait of David Zurek emphasizes the dancer's beautifully lean and languid body, which he used to great effect as a member of the Martha Graham Dance Company. Some portraits are elements from a larger series, as seen in Kurt Fishback's image of documentary photographer Mary Ellen Mark. Rena Small has been making hand portraits of artists since the 1970s, including those of architectural photographer Julius Shulman and artist Alexis Smith. Other photographers extend the notion of portraiture into places of work. Ira Nowinski composed the Paris studio of Man Ray into visual fragments, and Eve Arnold captured Orson Wells in a moment of rest on set with a cigar in his mouth. Lynn Hershman finds her own visage to be the ripest subject of investigation, with its vast potential for reconstruction detailed in surgical markings. Finally, Dora Maar, who was a recognized photographer when she became Pablo Picasso's muse, turns the camera toward her longtime friend Jacqueline Lamba, herself an artist and the former wife of Surrealist author André Breton. These images underscore the interwoven relationship between muse and maker, and how one informs the other in rich and varied ways.
