Formerly at the Cooper Hewitt

- 1.Luisa Cevese, Milan, founder Riedizioni, attracted to beautiful silk selvedges: castoffs from industrial silk manufacturing turning them into coveted fashion accessories.
- 2. Christina Kim, LA, dosa, deep respect for India's handweavers developed a design process for scraps over several fashion seasons
- 3. Reiko Sudo, NUNO, director Japanese textile company; deep exploration of traditional silk production in Japan led to transforming silk waste into textiles with greater creative relevance.

All 3 committed to history and tradition of textile making, and a commitment to design's environmental, social, and economic responsibilities.

Jamdani (Bengali: জামদানি) is one of the finest muslin textiles of Bengal, produced in South Rupshi of Narayanganj district in Bangladesh for centuries. The historic production of jamdaniwas patronized by imperial warrants of the Mughal emperors.
