

After fleeing Germany in 1939, Dzubas immigrated to the United States where he worked alongside iconic figures of Abstract Expressionism and Color Field painting, including Helen Frankenthaler, Morris Louis, and Jackson Pollock. Dzubas's early paintings resonate with Color Field ideology of employing color as an expressive force with potential to penetrate the human spirit and psyche. In the '70s and '80s, his abstractions transformed from grand and vivid painted splashes that immersed the viewer into dream-like scenes to more singular, block-like compositions. Here, Dzubas concentrates patches of color making them appear as magnified brushstrokes from an unseen larger image.
