Staff Dress Code

The purpose of a dress code at the Museum is to achieve a reasonable balance between three sometimes competing objectives:

1. Assuring employee safety and compliance with OSHA regulations,
2. Maintaining an appearance of professionalism among all employees, and
3. Enhancing employee morale and comfort in the workplace.

This dress code applies primarily to staff working in the Marks Administration Building or relative positions. Visitor Service Officers and Facility staff is provided with a uniform as part of the job requirements.

Being a seasonal organization, appropriate dress follows the season. During the busy season (winter, October – April), staff is asked to be well groomed in a professional manner (suits, ties and nylons are not required). During the slower months (summer, May – September) as programming, events, and schedules are reduced, staff is encouraged to be well groomed in a casual professional manner following the guidelines in the examples listed below:

Please remember that the casual professional summer dress code is a privilege and can be rescinded if deemed necessary.
