









Montgomery Suspension Dining Table, ca. 1960 Frey Hanging Table at Frey House I, 1953








Albert Frey architectural elevations of *Frey House I* (With Additions) includes detail of his suspension dining table. (drawings in museum archives)
















MONTGOMERY meets MODERNISM

This installation looks back at two Americas co-existing in Palm Springs

where the rich visual cultures of the traditional American West and the modernist lifestyle emerged and flourished. The group of actors, architects, artists, and designers that made their way to the desert communities during the 1940s through the 1960s established a dynamic community that is the foundation for the desert's rise to cultural prominence that remains relevant to this day – more than a half-century later.
