Pastor's Reflection

Autumn Upon Us

We are entering the Autumn Season, and with it we find subtle changes. The days are getting shorter again and the nights longer. The cool evening air has returned and many of us feel that we can breathe again, no longer breathing in thick, hot humid air. Leaves are beginning their bright yellow, and red colors, changing ever so slightly in color as they begin the end of their cycle. Those with gardens are finding an abundance of harvest, and those across the world in the Northern Hemisphere who

depend on this harvest for their winter meals are stocking up and canning. School is back in session, with children learning and frantically organizing their schedules: cross country, year-book, soccer, or cheer. Life is in the air but also our awareness of death and the end of the life cycle are ever present in this season as well.

In the book of Job, you will find a puzzling story, one bereft with controversy but also worthy for those struggling with what to do if they have entered a season of heavy grief. Job has a splendid life filled with everything he could ever want, bountiful fields of sheep and livestock, 10 children, servants, and friends. However, Satan sees how dutiful and obedient he is to God and decides to test him, telling God, let us take away all these things and see if he still is obedient and loving to you. You might expect God not to go through with this sort of action, but we find that indeed, all of Job's flocks, children, and servants die, and Job is left with his wife telling him to curse God and die!

Job is a case study in how we handle grief, disappointment, and the feeling that everything in life is chaotic and wrong. We are to live our lives even when terrible things happen, or the inevitable death happens. Reading Bible stories with no easy answers, perhaps ripping apart any palpable trust in God, is one thing. Experiencing death and grief, and choosing life and God is another.

Job amidst his dialogue with God, asking why God has done all this comes to a revelation. He insists even in all his grief and disappointment that he will know God as his Redeemer. Death does not have the last word. Death is not the end. That once Job has died, he will truly see God, and in this vision, his grief and worries will subside. "I know that my redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand on the earth. And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God; I myself will see him with my own eyes—I, and not another. How my heart yearns within me!" (Job 19:25-27 NIV).

As Christians, we know our Redeemer Jesus Christ who walks with us though unseen. But some days, some seasons might feel like we are Job. "Why O God are you conspiring against us?" you might proclaim. We do not claim to have all the answers even as practicing Christians, yet we can choose the hope of redemption in Christ, that Easter Hope of new resurrection found not only in the Easter season. May we cling onto Easter Hope in the harvest of Autumn, in the colors of the changing trees, new opportunities such as the new Family Services.

I encourage you all to become newly involved in one ministry of the church. That is all it takes to make the difference in the lives of a fellow congregant or community member who needs someone to sit with them in a difficult time to feel the promise of life in God. To hear the words of our Redeemer Jesus Christ in another. One of these ways is through our Family Service every first Monday of the month starting October 6th. With this service, we have an opportunity to minister to families, young and old, in a new way. Through fellowship over a shared meal, and interactive worship through story, song, and craft. May we begin this new season with the shared hope that our Redeemer is working through our actions, each end means a new beginning. God is besides us working in these times. Amen.

Your Session has been working with the committees of the church to better serve our church and community. The following is an update on some things the committees are working on:

It was decided we needed to have improved security for our church. Session voted to install 6 wireless solar power cameras covering all doors and parking lots. There will also be video doorbells installed at the two entrances into Fellowship Hall. In addition, two 12" Convex Security Mirrors will be installed in the front of the sanctuary.

The Baby Nursery will be cleaned and updated furniture, rugs and toys will be added. This will provide a place for small children to go during the worship service with adult supervision.

Lennon's House began meeting in our church in the spring. They are a day program for young adults with special needs. They have an office at the Pine Street Commons in Rockaway. Once a month they use our kitchen to learn how to prepare a meal and then enjoy the meal together.

Our Children's Sunday School has begun to use a new curriculum titled "Follow Me" Biblical Practice for Faithful Living.

Session continues to support the PCCNS for children 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 5 years old that meet downstairs Monday thru Friday from 8:30 am to 12:30 pm.

Hurricane Helene Assistance by the PCUSA

Helene made landfall in Florida late evening on September 26th as a very dangerous category 4 hurricane. The impact of Helene has been felt across multiple states. With the storm surge, wind damage, and flooding, it is crucial to have the necessary resources to support the many communities that are affected. Helene caused devastating damage in Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, North Carolina, and Tennessee. Your generous gifts will bring hope and encouragement.

PDA is in communication with affected presbyteries and National VOAD (Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster) to share information and coordinate resources as damage is assessed. We have approved several initial assistance grant requests and are anticipating additional requests from affected presbyteries to help respond to needs in their communities.




Volunteers Needed
