SCRIPTURE READINGS

Exodus 17:1-7

17 From the wilderness of Sin the whole congregation of the Israelites journeyed by stages, as the LORD commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink.² The people quarreled with Moses and said, "Give us water to drink." Moses said to them, "Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you test the LORD?" ³ But the people thirsted there for water, and the people complained against Moses and said, "Why did you bring us out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and livestock with thirst?"⁴ So Moses cried out to the LORD, "What shall I do for this people? They are almost ready to stone me." ⁵ The LORD said to Moses, "Go on ahead of the people and take some of the elders of Israel with you; take in your hand the staff with which you struck the Nile and go. ⁶ I will be standing there in front of you on the rock at Horeb. Sewer Line Replacement Cost

Over the past year, we have experienced multiple backups of the toilet and sink in the baby nursery. A video inspection of the sewer line from the baby nursery to the tie-in to the main sewer line in the downstairs girl's bathroom showed that it was corroded through in at least one location at the point of the tie-in of another line and had a low spot downstream of this tie-in. To prevent future backups the sewer line needed to be replaced. This required the concrete floor to be cut and removed for access to replace the sewer line between the baby nursery to the tie-in to the main sewer line in the downstairs girl's bathroom, the sewer line replaced, and the concrete floor replaced. This unplanned work cost \$14,500 and was not in this year's maintenance budget.
