## Blind #29 Designated as New Handicap Blind Location

Starting with the 2025–26 waterfowl season, **Blind #29** at Presque Isle State Park will officially become the **new handicap-accessible blind**, replacing the former ADA-designated location.

This update, made in partnership between the Northwestern PA Duck Hunters Association and Presque Isle State Park, addresses long-standing challenges related to parking and physical access.

The new site offers improved accessibility, making it safer and more functional for hunters with physical limitations. The **previous handicap blind** will now be converted into a **public blind**.

#### **A Reminder to All Hunters:**

The handicap blind is **not assigned to** any one individual during the duck blind drawing. It is open and available for use by elderly and/or disabled hunters on a first-come, first-served basis.

If you are **not elderly or disabled**, please do not use this blind.

## New Regulations for the 2025-26 Waterfowl Hunting Season

As we gear up for the 2025–26 waterfowl season at Presque Isle State Park, all hunters planning to enter the blind drawing or participate in blind setup must take note of several important updates and deadlines. Below is a quick guide to keep you informed and compliant.

#### **Key Dates for the 2025 Blind Drawing**

- Registration Opens: Friday, August 29, 2025 – 8:00 AM (Tom Ridge Environmental Center, except on 9/13/25)
- Saturday, September 13, 2025 4:00 PM (9/13 signup at Public Safety Building / Ranger's Station on Presque Isle due to renovation at TREC)
- Blind Drawing Day:
  Sunday, September 14, 2025 10:00 AM
  Live drawing will be streamed on
  Facebook. Sign-ups accepted 8:00–9:00
  AM at the Public Safety Building the
  morning of the draw. Final results posted
  on paduck.org.
- Blind Issuance & Selection:
  Saturday, September 27, 2025 10:00 AM at Picnic Shelter 2
  Drawing winners must arrive by 9:45 AM with required licenses/stamps for both owner and co-owner. No exceptions.
- Blind Removal Deadline: Sunday, January 25, 2026 – by sunset Blinds must be removed no later than the third Sunday after Lake Erie Zone season closes.

#### Reminders & Regulations

- In-Person Sign-Ups Only: Each hunter must register in person—no exceptions.
- Water Level Impacts:
  High water may impact some blind locations. Blinds 64 & 66 are temporarily suspended, and some spots (1–10, 37–41, 62, 63, 65, 68, 72, 73) may require boat access only.
- Blinds 29–32 Managed by Club:
  These blinds will be club-maintained and open to the public on a first-come, first-served basis. They are not available through the drawing.
- Littering is a Violation:
  Leave no trace. Hunters are required to remove all trash and materials after each hunt.

# PRESQUE ISLE STATE PARK YOUTH, VETERANS, AND MILITARY WATERFOWL HUNTING DAYS

September 20, 2025: Open to Junior License Holders aged 12-16

October 25, 2025: Open to Junior License Holders aged 12-16 and Veterans and Active Military

January 17, 2026: Open to Veterans and Active Military

Hunters participating in the September 20<sup>th</sup> hunt must use the orange staked blind locations established for Early Goose Season. A map of these locations is available at the park office. Hunting hours conform to Presque Isle State Park Early Goose Season hours. The October 25<sup>th</sup> and January 17<sup>th</sup> hunts follow regular hunting hours set forth by the PA Game Commission.

#### \*Important Information:

- Junior hunters must be accompanied by an adult.
- The adult may assist the youth in calling, duck identification and other aspects of the hunt, but may not be in possession of a firearm.
- Open for ducks, mergansers, Canada geese, gallinules, and coots.
- Same daily duck bag limits as regular season.
- Must follow all established PA Game Commission rules and regulations and PA State Park rules and regulations.

Important Information for the October 25, 2025, and January 17, 2026, hunts:

- All hunters must conform to the 2025 Waterfowl Blind Policies
- Hunting is only permitted from the approved blind locations. Temporary or portable blinds can be
  used at the approved blind locations during the January 17, 2025, Veterans and Active Military
  day if the seasonal blind has been removed by the blind holder due to the conclusion of the regular
  duck hunting season.
- Non-Veteran and Non-Youth hunters may still hunt geese when their season overlaps the special hunt days.





#### Presque Isle State Park

#### **HUNTING DATES AND TIMES:**

Early Canada Goose Season on Presque Isle State Park will open the day *after* Labor Day, September 2, 2025. The season will end on September 25, 2025. There will be no hunting prior to Labor Day on the park.

#### **BLIND LOCATIONS:**

For the 2025 Early Canada Goose Season only certain blind locations are approved. Stakes or buoys marked with black tape cannot be used for early goose. (See map for further details.) Permissible hunting times are broken down as follows:

- 1) Thompson Bay, Beach 11, and North Pier Blinds (Blind Locations 4 17):
  - a) From the start of legal hunting each day until 10:00 AM and from 4:00 PM until sunset each day.
- 2) No early goose hunting in Blind 71.
- 3) All other bayside blinds approved for early goose:
  - a) From the start of legal hunting each day until 10:00 AM (no evening hunting permitted).
- 4) No early goose hunting (September) is permitted in Marina Lake and around Sturgeon Bay.
  - a) Blinds 1, 2, 3, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60 and 61.
- 5) Due to high water levels, blind locations 4-10, 62, 63, 65, 67, 68, 72, and 73 may require boat access.
- 6) At locations 65, 72, and 73, blind construction is prohibited, instead, buoys will be placed at those locations that allow for the mooring of hunting boats.
- 7) Blind locations 64 and 66 are temporarily suspended due to high water levels.

See the map, on last page, for blind locations.

#### All hunting must take place from approved blind locations only. No exceptions.

Blinds must be temporary in nature, set up by the hunter(s) occupying the blind location each day, and removed completely by 10:00 AM and/or sunset. All evidence of hunting must be removed promptly after each hunting session. Blind materials cannot be left from a morning session in anticipation of returning for evening hunting. DO NOT LITTER! Shot shells are a major source of litter during waterfowl hunts. Please help keep the park clean by removing all empty shells.


Blind locations will be occupied on a first-come basis each day. If all locations are occupied, hunters cannot utilize additional blind locations.

#### **PROCEDURES:**

- Hunters should stop in initially at the Tom Ridge Environmental Center or Public Safety Building/Ranger Station to obtain procedures and a map showing approved blind locations.
- All hunters must have a valid PA Hunting License, PA Migratory Game Bird License and Federal Duck Stamp.

#### **GENERAL:**

- The cooperation of all participants is requested in this program. The park may still be busy with other types of recreation during this hunting period and hunters must exercise extreme care to ensure the safety of all park users. If other park users arrive to take part in other types of recreation, hunters are requested to suspend their hunting.
- All shooting must be directed away from park shores. There must be no discharge of guns on inland waters or land areas. The possession of a loaded gun outside the blind is not permitted except in pursuit of crippled waterfowl.
- Do not damage any natural resources or park facilities. Do not litter. Remove all evidence/trash, etc. of your presence at the end of each hunting period.
- Report any problems to the park office immediately at 814-833-7424 or the Ranger Station at 814-833-1495.
- During the remaining Goose hunting seasons, in the resident population zone, hunters are permitted to hunt from ALL approved blind locations. Temporary blinds may be used at these locations if permanent blinds are not present.
   Only one blind may be present at each location.

#### **EARLY CANADA GOOSE SEASON**

#### SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS

#### 2025 Season

You have been permitted to hunt Canada Geese on Presque Isle State Park as part of the park's Wildlife Management Program. With this privilege comes extra considerations because the season occurs during a period of the year that the park is still busy with visitors involved in other activities. We have established procedures for this hunt that will help ensure you can enjoy hunting, without unnecessarily impacting other types of recreation.

In order for this special season to be held in the future, the park is asking for your cooperation by:

- ☑ Hunting in the safest manner possible at all times.
- ☑ Following all procedures, guidelines, and rules established for this hunt.
- ☑ Complying with all PA Game Commission, State Park, and Federal Regulations.
- ☑ Acting cooperatively with other park users and fellow hunters.
- ☑ Discontinuing the use of a blind if park visitors arrive to take part in other activities such as, but not limited to, picnicking, fishing, or boating.

## PRESQUE ISLE STATE PARK - Rules for Ownership of Waterfowl Blind Blind Owners and Co-Owner Definitions - Rights and Responsibilities

- 1. The person, whose name is drawn, is the Primary Owner of the Blind.
- 2. The Primary Owner may list one other person as the Co-Owner of the Blind.
- 3. These designations are <u>permanent</u> and <u>cannot be changed</u> throughout the season.
- 4. The Owner or Co-Owner must be present at the Blind Pick:
  - a) Co-Owner must show proof of their PA Hunting License, PA Migratory Bird Privileges and Federal Duck Stamp and have the Owners blind application post card, PA Hunting License, PA Migratory Bird Privileges and Federal Duck Stamp.
  - b) Co-Owner is established on the day of pick. If Co-Owner is not present, the Owner must show proof of Co-Owner's eligibility (PA Hunting License, PA Migratory Bird Privileges and Federal Duck Stamp).
- 5. Both Owner and Co-owner have equal rights to occupy their blind, at any time. No other person, other than the two specific names on the permit, has the right, at any time, to ask another person/party to vacate a blind.
  - a) If you are using someone else's blind and someone shows up and claims to be the Owner or Co-owner and asks you to leave, that is their right to so, at any time, but identification must be shown to verify that they are in fact the Owner or Co-Owner. Park Rangers will not tolerate disputes and will ask all parties to leave the park.
- 6. When neither Primary Owner nor Co-owner are present, the blind may be used by the public. Non- Owners may <u>not</u> take possession of a blind anytime <u>earlier than one hour</u> before shooting hours. **No exceptions.**
- 7. A person's name may only appear on ONE blind permit on the park. If you are either the Owner or a Co-Owner on one blind, you may NOT be the Owner or Co-Owner on any other blind on the park that year.
- 8. With equal rights comes equal responsibility. Both Owner and Co-Owner are responsible for maintaining their blind. Trash bags should be provided, all trash must be removed after each hunt and the blind must be maintained for the public to use.
- 9. At the end of the season, both Owner and Co-owner are responsible for blind removal on or before the posted deadline.
- 10. Failure to remove your blind, by the deadline, will result in BOTH the Owner and Co-owner being fined and BOTH being placed on the list of ineligibility for future blind drawings.

Participation in this program is up to the person whose name is drawn. - This program is not mandatory.





## PRESQUE ISLE STATE PARK 2025 WATERFOWL BLIND POLICIES

#### Does not apply to Early or Late Goose Seasons

Waterfowl blind permits for Presque Isle State Park will be issued according to the following policies and procedures:

#### 1. ELIGIBILITY

All applicants must sign up in person during the established registration period (see Addendum). Every applicant must present a valid PA Hunting License, PA Migratory Bird Privileges, and Federal Duck Stamp before completing an application for the blind drawing. The applicant's signature must be on the licenses and stamp. Applications must be completed in person.

Hunters are not permitted to complete applications for others.

Note: Those persons who did not remove their blinds by the deadline for any one of the past five years are not eligible to participate in this year's drawing. No exceptions.

#### 2. GENERAL RESTRICTIONS

The following restrictions govern all waterfowl hunting on parklands and waters:

- a) Waterfowl hunting is only permitted at approved blind locations. Hunting on inland waters, including Lagoons, or land areas is not permitted, including Gull Point.
- b) All shooting must be directed away from park shores.
- c) No layout or boat blinds are permitted to set up in Marina Lake or Misery Bay (Misery Bay includes all areas north of Perry Monument).
  - 1) All layout and boat blind hunting must be 500 ft. offshore of the special management area at Gull Point and all other areas surrounding Presque Isle State Park on Lake Erie and Presque Isle Bay. Layout box tending from waterfowl blinds is permitted.
  - 2) Special Note: the end of the North Pier to the shore on Beach 11 is exactly 500 ft from shore. Both blind hunters and layout box hunters should remember to always be courteous of each other.
- d) All blind locations are subject to approval of park officials.
- e) The possession of a loaded gun outside the blind is not permitted except in pursuit of a crippled waterfowl.

#### 3. WATERFOWL BLIND PERMITS

Waterfowl blind permits are assigned by drawing 100 names of those registered. All times listed shall be in accordance with Eastern Standard Time or Daylight-Saving Time, as in effect on the date listed. The procedures shall be as follows:

- a) Registration: Each eligible person may register only once. **Do not separate postcard from stub**. Any person registering more than once will be disqualified. Registration will be at the Tom Ridge Environmental Center from August 29, 2025, to September 12, 2025, and at the Public Safety Building, located on Presque Isle State Park, on September 13, 2025.
- b) <u>Drawing</u>: The drawing will be held at the Public Safety Building on Presque Isle State Park. Signups will be taken from 8:00 AM to 9:00 AM the morning of the drawing outside of the Public Safety Building. At 10:00 AM, Club representatives will set up a FACEBOOK LIVE STREAM and the drawing will be done live online. One hundred numbers corresponding with the postcard numbers on the registration cards will be selected using a computerized random number generator. The random number generator found at <a href="https://www.random.org/">https://www.random.org/</a> will be used. The sequence drawn will determine the position the person drawn will have on the blind selection list. In the event that the random number generator is unavailable, the drawing will be conducted using numbered chips as in previous years. The listing will then be published immediately afterwards on www.paduck.org.
- c) <u>Notification by Postcard:</u> A postcard will be sent to everyone whose name is drawn so that you may prepare for the blind selection process. Please do not call the Presque Isle State Park office to find out if your name has been drawn.
- d) <u>Issuance of Waterfowl Blinds:</u> <u>All drawing winners must report by 9:45 AM.</u> Failure to arrive before the required time will result in blind forfeiture. The pick will take place starting at 10:00 AM on Saturday, September 27th at Picnic Shelter 2 on Presque Isle State Park (see addendum). Blind owners will receive a postcard, in the mail, with their drawing order number to pick their blind. Each drawing winner may bring only one guest to help with the selection. The Primary Owner or Co-owner must be present to pick the blind and must have <u>both</u> Primary and Co-Owner's sets of required signed documents: PA Hunting License, PA Migratory Bird Privileges and Federal Duck Stamp. Failure to have all required signed documents for both Owner and Co-Owner will result in blind forfeiture. No exceptions.
- e) <u>Late Assignments</u>: After all available blinds have been assigned, all remaining names on the selection list shall be discarded. Should there be any blind cancellations, forfeitures, etc., blinds will be reassigned by the Duck Club Blind Committee Chairman. Such reassignments can only be made after verification of the blind's availability. If the chairman does not have a builder for the vacant blind spot, a hunter may request permission to build at that location. This request may be made by contacting Shawn Feiock at 814-882-3473. Upon approval they will have to make arrangements to pick up a new blind permit and show that they meet the eligibility requirements of the new Owner and Co-Owner (PA Hunting License, PA Migratory Bird Privileges and Federal Duck Stamp).



f) <u>Listing of Permit Holders</u>: A list of permit holders and their telephone numbers is posted at the Public Safety Building on Presque Isle State Park and the NW PA Duck Hunters website, <u>paduck.org</u>, during the open waterfowl hunting seasons.

#### 4. DEADLINES FOR WATERFOWL BLINDS

Blinds must be erected by the date and time established for opening of the Lake Erie Zone Duck Season. If a permit holder fails to erect a blind by this time, the permit will be forfeited. The blind may be reissued following the late assignment policy noted previously.

All blinds, blind materials, posts, and litter must be removed by the time and date listed in the addendum for each year. Failure to do so will disqualify the permit holder from being eligible for a blind for a period of five successive yearly drawings. In addition, a \$100.00 penalty will be assessed by the Northwestern PA Duck Hunters' Association against those blind holders who fail to remove their blinds. Failure to pay the penalty will result in the five-year ineligibility being extended indefinitely until such time as payment is received. The permit holder may also face littering citations from the state for failure to remove materials from the blind site.

#### 5. TRANSFER OF BLIND PERMIT

The transfer of blind permits is not permitted. If a person is not able to use the permit, the Ranger Staff/Public Safety Building, and the PA DUCK Association Representative, must be notified, so that the permit can be reassigned.

#### 6. USE OF BLINDS

No more than five (5) persons may hunt together from a blind location at any one time. If the official permit holder is not occupying the assigned blind, other hunters may use the blind. If the official permit holder arrives later to use the blind other hunters must vacate the blind if requested to do so by the official permit holder. Hunters without an official permit must wait until 1 hour prior to shooting times daily to occupy blinds. All hunting, including regular season goose hunting, shall end on the last day of the established duck season for the Lake Erie Zone. This does not apply to any Late Goose Season approved for the park.

#### 7. CONSTRUCTION OF BLINDS

Permanent blinds are to be constructed by the permit holder from materials suitable to withstand the weather conditions experienced throughout the waterfowl seasons. Permanent blinds must include walls and a roof. All blinds must have permanently installed seats. Permit holders may not use park materials in the construction of blinds. Drift materials found on shore may be used. It is unlawful to nail to trees, destroy vegetation, or build an open fire on the park. No vegetative matter is to be brought on the park.

Blinds must be constructed so that they do not exceed 6 ft by 12 ft in size. Only one blind may be placed at each blind marker stake. Blinds must remain in an upright position and be usable by others when the blind holder is not present.

Orange stakes or buoys mark the location of all blinds. <u>Blinds must be located within 10 feet of the orange stake.</u> <u>Moving of blind stakes or buoys is expressly forbidden.</u> Failure to obey these rules will result in the loss of your blind permit.

Permit holders must post the blind permit in the blind throughout the entire season. If the permit is lost or destroyed, a new permit must be obtained from the NW PA Duck Hunters Association prior to any future hunting. No exceptions.

#### 8. GENERAL

The cooperation of all participants is important for the success of this program. The intent of this method of blind issuance is to give equal opportunity for the limited number of blinds available. Attempting to circumvent this process impacts all hunters and creates unfair situations.

Driving to remote blind locations to erect or remove a blind must be approved in advance by park officials. Failure to obtain the park's permission may result in the issuance of a citation to the offender and the forfeiture of the blind. It is not permissible to drive or park on service roads to drop off decoys or to hunt. Never block gates as this may prevent access to emergency vehicles. If parking along the side of the road, ensure all tires are completely off of the road and the multi-purpose recreation trail, that "no parking" signs are not posted and also do not block any park information signs. Failure to do so will result in parking fines. The feather access road is closed to all vehicle traffic. No exceptions. Contact the park office at 814-833-7424 with questions about access.

It is the hunter's responsibility to retrieve game. A boat or trained retriever is highly recommended due to deep water in front of many blinds.

The Park Office or Public Safety Building/Rangers must be notified if a blind is destroyed or removed for repairs by the owners. Absence of a blind for more than seven days may result in forfeiture of the blind permit. Park Staff or NW PA Duck Club Staff will attempt to contact a blind holder to inquire about a missing blind. Blinds can be removed by the owner prior to the close of duck season, but please notify the Park Office or Public Safety Building/Rangers staff if doing so.


Individuals selecting Blind #18 on the east shore of Misery Bay by the Coast Guard Station must use a boat to access their blind. <u>Do not trespass on United States Coast Guard property.</u> Due to high water levels, blinds 1-10, 37-41, 62, 63, 65, 67, 68, 72, and 73 may require boat access. At locations 65, 72, and 73, blind construction is prohibited, instead, buoys will be placed at those locations that allow for the mooring of hunting boats. Blind locations 64 and 66 are temporarily suspended due to high water levels.

Due to high water affecting blinds at locations 29, 30, 31, and 32, Duck Club Members will construct and maintain the blinds at these locations. These blinds will not be available to blind drawing winners. They will instead be open for first-come, first-serve, use throughout the season. This will add to the opportunities for those, not selected in the drawing, to hunt.




During the remaining Goose hunting seasons, in the resident population zone, hunters are permitted to hunt from ALL approved blind locations. Temporary blinds may be used at these locations if permanent blinds are not present. Only one blind may be present at each location.

## PRESQUE ISLE STATE PARK WATERFOWL BLIND REGULATIONS ADDENDUM 2025


Every individual license holder must complete an application for the blind drawing in person. Hunters are not permitted to complete applications for others. Sign-ups will be taken seven days a week at the Tom Ridge Environmental Center (TREC) from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM beginning on Friday, August 29<sup>th</sup> through Friday, September 12<sup>th</sup> and at the Public Safety Building, on Presque Isle State Park, on September 13<sup>th</sup>. Also, you may sign up on Sunday, September 24<sup>th</sup>, outside the Public Safety Building from 8:00 AM to 9:00 AM before the drawing. Sign-up dates, times, and locations are listed below:

Deadline for Removal of Blinds	All blinds and blind materials must be removed from the park by sunset, the third Sunday after the close of Lake Erie Zone Duck Season.  For the 2025/2026 season, the deadline for blind removal is Sunday, January 25, 2026, by sunset.  It is recommended that blinds be removed as soon as possible after the
	season, or when blind holders have finished hunting for the season, rather than waiting for the deadline date. If removing a blind early, notify the park office so the blind location can be allocated to other hunters.

\*Drawing: The drawing will be held at the Public Safety Building on Presque Isle. <u>Signups will be accepted from 8:00 AM to 9:00 AM</u> the morning of the drawing outside Public Safety Building. At 10:00 AM, Club representatives will set up a FACEBOOK LIVE STREAM and the drawing will be done live online. The listing will then be published immediately afterwards on www.paduck.org.

\*\*Issuance of Waterfowl Blinds: All drawing winners must report by 9:45 AM. Failure to arrive before the required time will result in blind forfeiture. The pick will take place starting at 10:00 AM on Saturday, September 27<sup>th</sup> at Picnic Shelter 2 on Presque Isle State Park. Blind owners will receive a postcard, in the mail, with their drawing order number to pick their blind. Each drawing winner may bring only one guest to help with the selection. The Primary Owner or Co-owner must be present to pick the blind and must have both Primary and Co-Owner's sets of required signed documents: PA Hunting License, PA Migratory Bird Privileges and Federal Duck Stamp. Failure to have all required signed documents for both Owner and Co-Owner will result in blind forfeiture. No exceptions. Picnic Shelter 2 Directions: The shelter is located on the corner of the western square pond. To reach the shelter from the park gate, travel approximately 2.6 miles into the park and take the first left turn past the Niagara boat launch. You will be heading back towards the entrance. Then take the first right turn to reach the picnic shelter parking area (see map below).



#### Water Level May Impact Blind Locations at Beach 11 and Locations on Park -

The Duck Club and the park will monitor water levels and shoreline configurations prior to and during the waterfowl seasons and <u>may</u> have to relocate or temporarily escrow locations that are unsuitable/unsafe for hunting due to conditions. Individuals selecting Blind #18 on the east shore of Misery Bay by the Coast Guard Station must use a boat to access their blind. <u>Do not trespass on United States Coast Guard property.</u> Due to high water levels, blind locations 1-10, 37-41, 62, 63, 65, 68, 72, and 73 may require boat access. At locations 65, 72, and 73, blind construction is prohibited, instead, buoys will be placed at these locations that allow for the mooring of hunting boats. Blind locations 64 and 66 are temporarily suspended due to high water levels. Due to high water affecting blinds at locations 29, 30, 31, and 32, Duck Club Members will construct and maintain the blinds at these locations. These blinds will not be available to blind drawing winners. They will instead be open for first-come, first-serve, use throughout the season. This will add to



the opportunities for those, not selected in the drawing, to hunt.

#### Special Note on Littering -

Littering at or in blinds is a punishable offense. When concluding your hunting session each day, remove all garbage, packaging, shot shells and food from the area. Do your part in protecting Presque Isle and the hunting opportunities that you enjoy. Contact the park office at 814-833-7424, immediately, if you observe violations. Blinds and blind materials left at blind locations after January 25, 2026, will also be considered litter.
