DONATION PROCESS:

- ➤ On your donation day, properly organize and separate your donations according to categories below. Park in clearly marked "Donation Drop Off" spot. Tables will be set up with corresponding category bins. You will be asked to put your donations into corresponding bins. All donations are checked prior to accepting. Any non-acceptable items will be returned or you will be asked to hold your donation until we have room to accept.
- Please organize your donated items according to categories below.
 - Art Studio: art supplies, studio equipment and tools, storage containers, etc.
 - Craft Stash: stationary materials, craft kits, fabric and needlework, gift wraps, etc.
 - Kitchen: bottle caps, wine corks, twist ties, bag clasps, magnets, cutlery, etc.
 - Living Room: tiny toys, board games, art/craft/science/DIY-related books, etc.
 - Attic: slides/filmstrips/negatives, DVDs/CDs/records, handmade items, small sports balls, etc.
 - Office: envelopes, folders, staplers, paper, scissors, tape, glue, stickers, etc.
 - Garage: small machinery parts/gears, usable tools, clean plant pots, small craft wood, etc.
 - Business: outdated swag, bags, signs, stickers, labels, display fixtures, stands, etc.

Unsure on Donation? Contact us to see if your items are acceptable



- made of organic material, alive or living.
- > unlabeled, rusty, toxic, leaking, or dangerous (e.g., broken or sharp edges).
- smelly, moldy, dirty, smoke-damaged, insect-damaged, or in bad condition.
- been exposed to the elements for most of its life or stored outside.
- more appropriate for a thrift store or other reuse outlet (e.g., clothing, furniture, building materials).
- > a personal care item or a used medical device.
- > contained medication or hazardous material.
- culturally or racially insensitive.
