## Pastor's Ponderings - The Road of Grief:

Each year on All Saints Sunday we remember the people who have left their mark on our church, our lives and our hearts. We focus on the journey of grief. In my sermon I mentioned resources I would include in our Triad. These insights are helpful markers along that road:

*We've learned a few important things about grief:*

Grief is not a straight road—it winds through laughter and tears, memory and silence.

- It's not something to get over, but something to grow through.”
- It is unique and non-linear:
  - It can come, subtly quietly whispering to your soul, or like a crashing wave overwhelming you with emotional paralysis.
  - There is no normal or prescribed way to move through grief. There are some helpful typical patterns of grief, but don't presume they apply universally or linearly.
- It involves more than just the initial loss:
  - You don't just lose a person; you also lose their roles, the dreams you had together, and the meaning in the role you played in their life.
- It can be a process of rebuilding, not just recovering:
  - The goal is not to "get over" the loss, but to learn how to build a meaningful life alongside the memory of the person you lost.
  - Time does not heal grief. You may feel you have gotten past its intensity only to be incapacitated by some small sight or sound or smell that activates it all over again.
  - Grief is normal, but if you still feel that it handicaps your capacity to live, or work, or relate after a few months it may be helpful to seek a therapist or group that specializes in grief work.
  - It means discovering the textures and images of a new landscape with that empty chair.

### THANKSGIVING THOUGHTS:

Do you know that research tells us that the wiring of our brain makes it difficult for us to hold gratitude and anger in our mindset the same time? That's true as well for gratitude and depression. Or gratitude and sadness. Or gratitude and most any 'negative' emotion. The circuitry of our brain will toggle between one or the other but won't activate on both at the same time. It may seem like we are feeling both because that toggle can happen quickly; instantly. But the more we focus on gratitude, the harder it will be for those other emotions to take hold of our hearts.

### ADVENT DEVOTIONAL

Advent is quickly approaching. I've heard so many folks talking about how quickly time seems to be moving. To help us find a sacred pace to the season we have a devotional crafted by a writers' group from our denomination. It is entitled: "Soon & Very Soon". It draws on images from that song that speak to how hard it is to wait for relief or justice or healing or resolution. We'll be weaving some of the themes from the devotional into our worship themes. Copies will be available Sunday morning in the Narthex.

We also have an Advent Calendar. Each day you will have an opportunity to 'scratch' off a surface to reveal a prompt for prayer. Building on the worship themes of waiting for Hope, Peace, Joy and Love, the calendar will give you thoughts for reflection and prayer. This will also be available in our church Narthex.

### **UPDATES & OUTCOMES – 'THE HEARTBEAT INITIATIVE'**

Through her college work this year, **Allison Darling**, a member of our church, was able to provide volunteer service in **Kisumu, Kenya** at several community health centers and hospital. During her work she realized that across Kenya, police officers, firefighters, and community health providers are often the first to arrive at emergency scenes, yet few have access to CPR training. Without these lifesaving skills preventable deaths occur every day. To address this concern, **Allison created The Heartbeat Initiative** to address the need. The mission is to ensure no life in Kenya is lost because help arrived unprepared. They partner with local organizations to train first responders in CPR. Through structured, evidence-based workshops, participants learn how to recognize cardiac arrest, deliver chest compressions, and respond confidently before ambulance or hospital teams arrive.

The **Heartbeat Initiative** program not only builds individual skills, but it also strengthens the entire emergency response system. By empowering frontline responders, they are reducing time to first intervention, increasing survival rates, and fostering collaboration between community members and hospitals.

Allison is returning to Kisumu, Kenya between January 12-25, 2026 to oversee a **Heartbeat Initiative** training event for 400 delegates. Allison, as founder of the Initiative, has been raising funds for the Initiative. Allison presented the focus of the Initiative and goal of providing CPR training events to the Mission Committee in November. The Mission Committee was impressed with the overall project plan to achieve the first training event. On behalf of Central Congregational Church, we agreed to contribute a financial gift of \$1500 from our Board Designated Fund to help achieve a \$17,000 budget for this event. **Personal donations from church members are welcomed! ### **Tibetan Refugee Self Help Center, Darjeeling, India**

Since January 2024 we have been sponsoring through UCC Global Ministries Child & Elder Sponsorship Program **TENZIN YANGZOM**. Tenzin is 8 years of age. Letters and drawings received from Tenzin and family information are posted on the mission bulletin board in the Vestry. The Mission Committee recently approved a gift donation of \$500 for the school, sent through the UCC Children's Sponsorship Office, to support the children's school and provide a fun event for Tenzin's classmates. This rehabilitation organization trains adults in handicraft arts to support their families while children are provided free education, in both Hindu and English. ## ***A Visit from St. Nicholas***

(Written in 1823)

By Clement Clarke Moore 1779 – 1863

*'Twas the night before Christmas, when all through the house,*

*Not a creature was stirring, not even a mouse;  
The stockings were hung by the chimney with care,  
In hopes that St. Nicholas soon would be there;  
The children were nestled all snug in their beds,  
While visions of sugar-plums danced in their heads;  
And mamma in her 'kerchief, and I in my cap,  
Had just settled our brains for a long winter's nap,  
When out on the lawn there arose such a clatter,*

*I sprang from the bed to see what was the matter.  
Away to the window I flew like a flash,  
Tore open the shutters and threw up the sash.  
The moon on the breast of the new-fallen snow  
Gave the lustre of mid-day to objects below,  
When, what to my wondering eyes should appear,  
But a miniature sleigh, and eight tiny reindeer,  
With a little old driver, so lively and quick,  
I knew in a moment it must be St. Nick.  
More rapid than eagles his coursers they came,  
And he whistled, and shouted, and called them by name;  
"Now, Dasher! now, Dancer! now, Prancer and Vixen!  
On, Comet! on, Cupid! on, Donner and Blitzen!  
To the top of the porch! to the top of the wall!  
Now dash away! dash away! dash away all!"  
As dry leaves that before the wild hurricane fly,  
When they meet with an obstacle, mount to the sky;  
So up to the house-top the coursers they flew,  
With the sleigh full of Toys, and St. Nicholas too.  
And then, in a twinkling, I heard on the roof  
The prancing and pawing of each little hoof.  
As I drew in my head, and was turning around,  
Down the chimney St. Nicholas came with a bound.  
He was dressed all in fur, from his head to his foot,  
And his clothes were all tarnished with ashes and soot;  
A bundle of Toys he had flung on his back,  
And he looked like a peddler just opening his pack.  
His eyes—how they twinkled! his dimples how merry!  
His cheeks were like roses, his nose like a cherry!  
His droll little mouth was drawn up like a bow  
And the beard of his chin was as white as the snow;  
The stump of a pipe he held tight in his teeth,  
And the smoke it encircled his head like a wreath;  
He had a broad face and a little round belly,  
That shook when he laughed, like a bowlful of jelly.  
He was chubby and plump, a right jolly old elf,  
And I laughed when I saw him, in spite of myself;  
A wink of his eye and a twist of his head,  
Soon gave me to know I had nothing to dread;  
He spoke not a word, but went straight to his work,  
And filled all the stockings; then turned with a jerk,  
And laying his finger aside of his nose,  
And giving a nod, up the chimney he rose;  
He sprang to his sleigh, to his team gave a whistle,  
And away they all flew like the down of a thistle,  
But I heard him exclaim, ere he drove out of sight,  
"Happy Christmas to all, and to all a good-night."*
