

Insight - Future of Our Church Initiative

PRAY SEEKING TO KNOW OUR 'WHY' AS A CHURCH - INDIVIDUAL DISCERNMENT STEPS

<u>Step 1</u>: <u>Preparation</u> Begin in silent prayer, then ask of your deepest, truest self, <u>"What does God want of</u> <u>Central Congregational Church?"</u> Then ask this question weekly. Keep the focus on what God is inviting you (us) to be or do. Even if you feel the answer is hard to determine.

<u>Step 2: Holy Indifference to Outcome</u> Can you be at peace with whatever God shows you in this discernment, regardless of the outcome? If not, ask God to help you with that. Do you desire to know what God wants in this situation? If there is fear or a block, acknowledge it and ask God for help.

Step 3: Practical Considerations What are the facts surrounding the original question, "What does God want of CCC?" What are the practical considerations and options? The pros and cons for each option? What beliefs and values affect the question?

Steps 4 -7 will be shared in the next Triad.

Below is the prayer provided on Palm Sunday to post at home on your refrigerator. Pause and quietly say the prayer throughout the week.

Please God, let me (us) be content for you to lead the way. Help me (us) to be willing to live your plan each day. Keep me (us) very close to you all through the coming week, and let my (our) heart(s) be open wide to hear you when you speak. In Jesus' name. Amen.

Thank God for our Food God said [to Adam and Eve], 'See, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit; you shall have them for food.-Genesis 1:29

There's an old joke about the first-grade teacher who asks her class, "Where do apples come from?" Little Ian speaks up: "From the supermarket!"

We laugh, but the sad truth is that many of us are so far removed from farms that we forget that our food – every bite – comes from life, life that God alone created. Yes, farmers sow seeds and care for the plants and trees, but it's God's miracle of life that makes them grow.

As stewards and disciples, we desire to cultivate in ourselves and our communities a deep appreciation for all God provides us, particularly what we need to live. With every mouthful at every meal we thank God for our daily bread, and for the soil, air and water that sustains life.

Easter and springtime are perfect occasions to celebrate God's miracle of life that gives us fruit, vegetables, grains, meat, fish and dairy foods. Here are some ideas:

- Mealtime grace, thank God not only for food, but also for the cycles of seedtime, growth and harvest; for lifenourishing soil, water and air.
- While eating, discuss the origins of the variety of food on your plate. How and where are the plants grown? How do they get to your kitchen?
- As a church or family, celebrate Earth Day (Saturday, April 22) by learning about food production and how climate change, pollution and economics impact our food.
- Celebrate Earth Day by planting a garden in your yard or community garden on church grounds.
- Learn about nutrition -- what foods are the best and worst for us, and why. Promote healthy eating.

Committee Corner

Learn about food waste in our culture and take steps to reduce it in your home. At church, reserve a Sunday for a service highlighting creation and food. Maybe "Blessing of the Seeds," or the ancient "Rogation Sunday" ritual.

<u>Looking Ahead: May Mission - Project</u> <u>Bread – Walk for Hunger</u>

For 17 years , our member, Bill Bentley, has participated and completed the twenty mile *Walk for Hunger* held annually by Project Bread. The actual 20-mile walk did not take place in Boston in 2020 and 2021 due to COVID and continued only as a virtual walk in 2022. This year, on Sunday, May 7th, the walk in Boston will resume. The plan is to encourage participants to complete the one-mile loop around the Boston Common three times, or as many times as they desire. Nevertheless, <u>Bill will continue</u> <u>his twenty mile walk route through North</u> Attleboro as he has done since 2020.

Let's support the Walk for Hunger and help Bill to significantly exceed his GOAL by visiting, www.projectbread.org **On-line Instructions**: After the site opens click on The Walk for Hunger. Then click on SEARCH in the donate section. Then click - Find Participant. When that window opens, in the spaces provided, type in William Bentley, click Find / then click on Bill's name. Then click and you will be able to type in your contribution. Then click on Donate Now. We prefer you don't send checks to the church for this purpose unless that's the best method for you! In that case make your check payable to Central Congregational Church and on the memo, line write 'Project Bread'. We'll be sure Bill receives credit for all donations received.

By the way, when you decide you're donat-

ing, why not consider a dollar amount per mile times the 20 Bill is walking. Another option for 'walkers' is to set a personal donation goal per mile for yourself for one day or over several days in a selected week. Let's say you'll give \$5 for every mile you walk. Enjoy your walk and contribute that amount toward Bill's goal. Have family at home or in the area? Why not make it a family fun walk! As a group set your walk goal and contribution per mile. Multiply that by the number of walkers in your group.

Let's all get involved and support Project Bread and our formal representative – Bill Bentley – as he completes his 18th annual 'Walk for Hunger'!
