

From the Stewardship Committee STEWARDS OF THE GIFTS OF GOD'S GRACE (part 3)

It is vital to keep in mind as we look into the topic of spiritual gifts and their purpose that the focus of the gift be on the Giver (God). The gifts are given out great love to be shared in love with one another. A mistake some Christians can make is turning the focus of the spiritual gifts toward ourselves. Its easy to get excited about our gift and the ways we can use it and we forget that the gift is a working of the Holy Spirit in our lives for the purpose of bringing glory to God. (Arthur, Kay, Lawson, David, and BJ. Understanding Spiritual Git. New

York:Waterbrook. P. 24) Sometimes we do receive some attention as we serve, but we always need to redirect the attention to God. Let's keep that in mind as we continue in our exploration of spiritual gifts. 4 There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. 5 There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord, 6 There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work. 7Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. 8 To one there is given through the Spirit a message of wisdom, to another a message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit, 9 to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by that one Spirit, 10 to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of tongues. 11All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he distributes them to each one, just as he determines. (1 Corinthians 12:4-11 NIV) In this passage, Paul begins by stating very clearly that God distributes the spiritual gifts as He sees fit. The second thing he states is very important...all of the gifts are "given for the common good". The gifts are not to be used

selfishly by the person given the gift. The gifts are to be used in harmony with all followers for the greater good of the whole. He then goes on to call out many of the gifts individually and reiterate the fact that they are given by the same Holy Spirit as God wishes them to be given. (Unpacking Paul - 1 Corinthians 12 - The Spiritual Gifts Project) Then Paul goes on to make a comparison of the human body to the body of Christ (the church). All parts of the body are needed and dependent on each other to work effectively. So too with the gifts given to each of us in the church (the Body of Christ). We need each other's gift to accomplish what God has in mind for His church at large and our specific church. ALL OF US ARE IMPORTANT! I urge you to, if you are not already doing so, ask God to help you see what the gift is that He gave you. Then ask how He wants you to use it.

<u>August Mission Project –</u> <u>Lenore's Pantry</u>

Although we annually, year-round, receive donations for Lenore's Pantry, the Mission Committee chose to boost our support through designating the pantry as our August

focus.

Lenore's serves families and the elderly in North Attleboro. Food insecurity continues to be faced by many seniors and local families as evident by the regular request received by the pantry. Many seniors supplement their fixed incomes by coming to the pantry for food assistance. Families living with food insecurity often need to visit the pantry to supplement their grocery budget. When donations are low, everyone gets less and sometimes the pantry shelves are bare.

We are asking for contributions by check, made payable to Central Congregational Church. On the memo line please designate your contribution by writing 'Lenore's Pantry'.

In consultation with the director of the pantry we continue to use your contributions to purchase Gift Cards at their preferred grocery stores. The gift cards are used to purchase specific food items not received from the public or to assist an individual or family with a 'special needs' purchase.

If preferred, you can also make a difference in the lives of people who live among us by simply picking up one food item (more if you are able) and dropping it off at church on Sundays or bringing it to the church office during office hours.
