Landwermeyer, Jr. Brigadier General, USA Retired, wrote in their 2023 annual report, "HFOT continues to work tirelessly to restore some of the freedom and independence our Veterans sacrificed while serving our country, through the gift of a specially adapted

home. There are now 375 Veterans and their families living in barrier-free environments, with more than 70 home-build projects in various stages of construction nationwide. Based on Veterans Affairs numbers, we estimate that over 1,000 severely injured post-9/11 Veterans are still in need of adapted housing." One of these homes is being built today in Holden. MA for Marine Sgt. Craig Brady! Our donations to HFOT will be designated to support this local construction project. On Sunday, October 20th, Cheryl Peterson, who is on staff with HFOT, will share additional insight during our morning Worship Service.
