



## Potty Training Made Simple

### What You'll Need:

- Small, tasty rewards (tiny enough to easily chew).

### Let's Get Started:

1. Wake Up & Go:
  - When your puppy wakes up, the first thing to do is grab some yummy rewards and quickly take them outside. This helps "jumpstart" your success in potty training!
2. Time to Go:
  - Walk around the yard and say, "GO POTTY" in a calm voice.
  - Don't stare—just walk around and let your puppy sniff and explore.
3. Yay, You Did It!
  - When your puppy starts to potty, wait until they are done before saying, "GOOD PUP, GO POTTY!" and giving a reward.
  - Celebrate with lots of praise and love after they finish.
4. Poop Time Too:
  - After peeing, your puppy might need to poop. Say, "GO POOPS."
  - Walk around again until they start, then wait until they're done before cheering, "GOOD PUP, GO POOPS!" and rewarding.
  - Tip: Watch how long it takes your pup to poop after meals. In the morning, if they don't go right away, they might need to poop about 10 minutes after coming inside, thanks to the stimulation of being indoors.





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### Troubleshooting:

- Pretend Potty:
  - If your puppy fakes a potty with a little squat, say, "GOOD PUP, NOW GO POTTY," and keep walking.
  - If nothing happens after 10 minutes, take them inside for a short break in the crate. Then, try again!

### Handling Accidents:

- Catch It:
  - If you see your puppy starting to go inside, clap and say, "STOP!" Then, take them outside right away. Once they finish pottying or pooping outside, reward them right there with praise and a reward.
- Clean & Forget:
  - If you find an accident later, just clean it up without making a fuss. No need for scolding—they won't understand!

### Extra Tips:

- Keep Them Close:
  - Attach the leash to you so you can quickly spot when they need to go.

### Keep It Positive:

- Potty training takes a little patience, but with consistency, your puppy will learn quickly.
- Always keep it fun and encouraging!
