Message from the Board

There are just a few items that we wanted to let residents know this month:

- The compound is not a secure area. Some items were stolen from one of the boats in the compound over the winter. We'd like to ask all residents to check their compound storage space regularly, and just be aware that there are many people with access to the compound.
- Please do not dump large household items or bulk garbage in the dumpsters at the compound. You will be charged a removal fee for these items. There are two dumps very close to us that accept these items--on Highway 90 across from North Myrtle Beach Middle School and on Highway 111 near the intersection with Highway 57 in Brooksville.
- There will be three openings on the board this summer (in addition to committee chair vacancies); please consider joining us. We need your help!
- We'd like to invite all business owners in the village to submit their information for a business card-sized space/link on our website. We are testing out this program. (The rules may change over the coming months.)
- The trees in Windjammer Village are one of our biggest assets. Many of the other communities in our area are built on clear-cut land; these homes do not have mature trees. Trees provide us with many benefits: Cooling shade, defense from cold winter winds, attract birds and wildlife, purify our air, prevent soil erosion, clean our water, and add grace and beauty to our homes and community. Remember to check the rules and regulations when you are considering tree removal. There are many resources to help you manage your trees without removing them.

We made a mistake last month


