## The Windjammer Village Swimming Pool

The Swimming Pool is one of the village's most used amenities over the summer months. In order for all of us to safely enjoy the pool, rules have been established by the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC). If these rules are not observed, Windjammer Village can be fined and have our pool immediately closed.

Some common rules from DHEC that are frequently broken include:

- No Diving
- No Running on the Pool Deck
- 6' clearing must be maintained between the pool and the pool furniture.

Violations of these rules can result in having your pool/clubhouse card turned off without warning. The village volunteers and staff are not babysitters or watchdogs, but they do have the responsibility of keeping WJV an enjoyable place for **everyone**. We ask that our residents please take a moment to read the pool rules on the sign at the pool and the pool regulations included in the Windjammer Village Rules and Regulations. (These can be found on our website or in the POA office.)

There are a few other pool issues that can cause maintenance problems and pool closings during the busy summer season:

- Last year we had a problem with Black Algae. This is brought into the pool from other areas (pool toys, bathing suits, and on your person). The most common source is swimming in ocean, rivers, and lakes before entering the pool. Please shower and rinse off pool toys before entering the pool with these items, especially if you have been using them elsewhere.
- Cigarette butts, candy and food wrappers, and bottle tops tossed or left in the pool area always seem to find a way into the pool filters. Please pick up after yourselves.

**Safety and cleanliness at the pool is everyone's responsibility!**

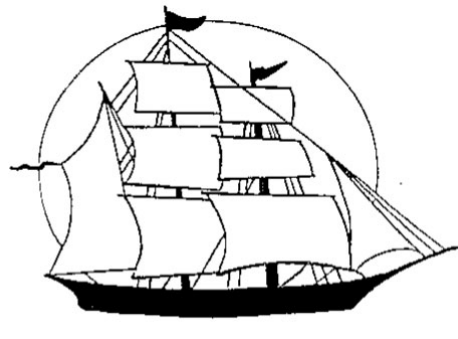
## Lost and Found:
