ELECTION REPORT



BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE

Many volunteers are doing the watering, but we STILL NEED MORE helpers!

The Beautification Committee has met twice since last report. Once on May 27th about general issues, and again on June 10th with the residents of Vereen Circle to address a bare area on their particular circle. About 6 or 7 people attended in addition to beautification members and a consensus was formed with tentative plans, and one palm was installed there today. We are dependent on THOSE residents to help with watering. Ask not or ye just might receive!

A proposal was submitted to the Board for the membership to vote upon to broaden the scope of the beautification committee, but this has not been approved to be placed onto the 2015/16 ballot. The proposal basically asked that beautification not be limited to outdoor and/or landscaping. While Beautification may make recommendations to other Committees and to the Board of Directors, it shall not ultimately control the decisions and budgets of other committees with respect to their areas of primary responsibilities. The maintenance of an overall natural appearance of outdoor areas should always be considered.

The Beautification Committee welcomes all ideas and recommendations, and is intent upon building a consensus of opinions so that the membership overall is happy. *Stefan Varner, Chair*
