

All Windjammer Village Residents,

The WJV Compound Committee (EC) has been very active of late trying to accommodate many Compound storage requests from residents, and as a result spaces have become very limited. Spaces remain available for open trailers and smaller boats, but very difficult to obtain space for larger vehicles. As a result, a few comments from the CC.

- 1) Prior to purchasing or upgrading to another vehicle, an inquiry should be sent to the CC regarding available space(s). Otherwise, your only option may be to utilize external storage.
- 2) Storage/parking of boats/trailers/campers at your residence is against the WJV Rules and Regulations and should be avoided.
- 2) Do not assume just because the space is unoccupied that it is available. It is very likely, especially at this time of year, that boats/campers are out for other reasons. The CC maintains the master of assigned storage locations, and should be contacted prior to any movement.

And as a reminder.

GENERAL RULES OF WJV COMPOUND

- 1) Keep assigned space clean, free of debris, and properly maintained.
- 2) All spaces <u>REQUIRE</u> annual renewal applications, along with vehicle registrations and proper ownership ID. This request will be sent in the fall of each year.
- 3) In order to ensure your assigned space is not "lost" or assigned elsewhere, a sign should be placed on each denoting your last name and WJV Resident lot number (example H18)
- 4) All vehicles / boats stored in the compound require some type active movement periodically. There are several boats / trailers stored currently that have likely not moved in a year or more. The CC will begin soon applying "TOW" notices to those and communicate warnings to the owners prior to removal. So please ensure your "vehicle" is active and movable if you choose to continue using The Compound.

Smoky Cheesy Chicken-Potato Casserole

Shortcut ingredients including frozen hash browns and cream of chicken soup make this chicken-potato bake doable even on a busy weeknight. Top the chicken-potato casserole with crushed croutons for a crunchy, crave able finish.

Prep: 20 mins **Bake:** 40 mins **Total:** 60 mins **Servings:** 12

Ingredients

- 1 10.75 ounce can condensed cream of chicken with herbs soup
- 18 ounce carton sour cream
- 1 ½ cups shredded smoked cheddar cheese (6 ounces)
- 1 28 ounce package frozen diced hash brown potatoes with onions and peppers, thawed
- 1 pound smoked or roasted chicken, cut into bite-size strips
- 1 cup crushed croutons (optional)
- 1 tablespoon butter, melted (optional)
- Fresh thyme (optional)

Directions

Step 1

Preheat oven to 350°F. Lightly grease a 13x9x2-inch baking pan; set aside. In a large bowl combine soup, sour cream, and cheese. Stir in hash brown potatoes and chicken. Transfer mixture to the prepared baking pan. If desired, in a small bowl combine crushed croutons and melted butter; sprinkle over chicken mixture.

• Step 2

Bake for 40 to 50 minutes or until heated through. If desired, garnish with fresh thyme.
