If you can donate some of your time, at your discretion, to help with a project, please contact Jason at 763-772-8248 to be added to the list.







#### PRALINE CRUNCH

**Author: Plain Chicken** 

Yield: 12 cups | Prep Time 10 mins | Cook Time 1 hr | Total Time 1 hr 10 mins

#### Ingredients:

- 8 cups Crispix cereal
- 2 cups pecan halves (I use salted)
- ½ cup brown sugar, packed
- ½ cup corn syrup
- ½ cup butter
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- ½ tsp baking soda

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Preheat oven to 250°F.
- 2. In a large bowl, combine cereal and pecans.
- 3. In a large saucepan over medium high heat, combine brown sugar, corn syrup and butter. Bring to a boil, stirring occasionally. Remove from heat and stir in vanilla and baking soda. Pour over cereal mixture, tossing to coat evenly.
- 4. Pour cereal mixture into a 9×13-inch pan. Bake for 1 hour, stirring every 20 minutes.
- 5. Pour onto wax or parchment paper to cool. Break into pieces.



Use a large saucepan when making the brown sugar/corn syrup mixture. The mixture will bubble up when you add the baking soda.

Can substitute any type of Chex cereal for Crispix. I use salted pecan halves. You can substitute unsalted if you prefer.






