

## Some interesting facts about no see ums

- If you love chocolates, then you might know where we get chocolates from? It is the cocoa powder that is the main constituent of chocolate that we get from cocoa tree, right? This may be surprising for you, but the no see ums and gull midges are the only insects that help in pollination of the cocoa trees the primary source for chocolate powder. So you can say it is essential to have no see ums to get more and more cocoa beans.
- The no see ums are attracted towards the odour emitted by humans. When you breathe out carbon dioxide, it acts as an attraction for the **no see ums**, and they are also attracted to lactic acid as well.
- The larvae of the no see ums hardly takes twenty-eight days to develop into an adult, but in some cases, this span can increase up to a year.
- It is not only the moist places and standing water where the no see ums can breed but you can also find the larvae of the no see ums being developed in a rotten fruit as well.
- No see ums can also cause a disease named as the blue tongue to the livestock which is stung by these gnats.







# **BOATING NEWS**

(Shared by Priscilla Tinsley)

#### ON BOARD FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

Now is the time to take a good look at the fire extinguishers you have on board. Beginning April 20, new U.S. Coast Guard regulations takes effect that change extinguisher expiration dates and the minimum classification of fire extinguishers carried aboard boats.

The new U.S. Coast Guard regulation puts a 12-year expiration on all disposable (non-rechargeable) fire extinguishers. The manufacture date may be two or four digits (e.g., 08 or 2008) stamped into the bottom of the bottle or near the UL label.

And the other big change: boats that are model-year 2018 or newer must carry newer "5-B", "10-B", and "20-B" classified extinguishers rather than those with the older "B-I" and "B-II" labels, which are being phased out. The number in the new labels refers to the size (in square feet) of a potential fire the device is suitable to extinguish. For boats less than 26 feet and 2018 model year or newer, fire extinguishers must be unexpired "5-B" "10-B" or "20-B". For 2018-and-newer recreational boats 26-65 feet, requirements vary.







### SCDNR News: a New Law - March 14, 2022

A new law increases the distance limit for boating to 100 feet on most state waters and prohibits wake surfing within 200 feet on all S.C. waters. A new law signed into effect March 14 by Gov. Henry Dargan McMaster establishes on most of South Carolina's major reservoirs a new 100-foot distance limit that boats underway must observe when approaching a dock, a person in the water or an anchored vessel.

The new law, which doubles the previous distance of 50 feet, applies to the waters of Lake Greenwood, Lake Hartwell, Lake Jocassee, Lake Keowee, Lake Marion, Lake Monticello, Lake Murray, Lake Robinson, Lake Russell, Lake Secession, Lake Thurmond, Lake Wateree, Fishing Creek Reservoir, Parr Reservoir, or the portion of the Savannah River from the Interstate 20 Savannah River Bridge to the New Savannah River Bluff Lock and Dam. The 100-foot distance limit does not apply to Lake Moultrie.
