As per RRR Article II, section 8: "all golf carts are to be marked with the appropriate lot number". Windjammer Village will be issuing license plates, which will be mounted on the back of all golf carts. These new golf cart plates will be four inches in height and seven inches long. They will be made of aluminum with rounded corners and two mounting holes. They will have a gold background with black lettering. The number for your golf cart will be the letter of your circle and your four-digit address. The main reason for this is to make it easier to identify various infractions committed by owners or their guests. We have had everything from lawnmower engines to living room hutches placed in our dumpsters, there are many times where we have not been able to identify who the owner was who committed these violations and so all of us must pay for the removal of the item. Other examples of violations include under-age drivers operating golf carts, identifying people who bend or break our gates, and dumping items in our leaf/branch pile that should not be dumped. Recently, someone dumped three garbage bags in the leaf pile and they turned out to be actual kitchen garbage. The cameras see the golf carts but it's very hard to see the lot number, if there is one at all. There will be a small form to be filled out which will list the make, color, year, and serial number of your golf cart. This will be handy in case a golf cart is stolen. All the pertinent information will be on this form. We are hoping that, with this easier way to identify a golf cart. it will deter people from committing infractions. It will be easier for a fellow owner to ID a golf cart involved in any type of rule violation.

These new license plates will be at no cost to owners and can be installed by our maintenance department if needed. There will be a grace period for all golf carts to register and get their license plate. There will be days set up when you can drive to the maintenance building and have your plate installed.

To get this started we are asking all golf cart owners to email or call Pamela at the office and have her add your cart to the owners list. We thank you for your cooperation during this new implementation.



BEWARE OF MOSQUITOS DO YOUR PART TO CONTROL THEM.

Facts About Mosquitoes

Adult mosquitoes live indoors and outdoors.

 Mosquitoes can bite day and night.

 Adult mosquitoes live for about 2 to 4 weeks depending on the species, humidity, temperature, and other factors. Female mosquitoes often live longer than male mosquitoes.

 Only female mosquitoes bite people and animals to get a blood meal. Female mosquitoes need a blood meal to produce eggs.

- Mosquitoes get infected with germs, such as viruses and parasites, when they bite infected people and animals.
- It takes just a few infected mosquitoes to start an outbreak in a community and put you and your family at risk of becoming sick.

Remove Standing Water Where Mosquitoes Lay Eggs

- Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out any items that hold water like tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpot saucers, or trash containers. Mosquitoes lay eggs near water.
- Tightly cover water storage containers (buckets, cisterns, rain barrels) so mosquitoes cannot get inside to lay eggs.
- For containers without lids, use wire mesh with holes smaller than an adult mosquito.
- Fill tree holes to prevent them from filling with water.
- If you have a septic tank, repair cracks or gaps.
 Cover open vent or plumbing pipes. Use wire mesh with holes smaller than an adult mosquito.





- Wear long-sleeved shirts and pants to keep prevent bites
- Use EPA-registered repellents when spending time outdoors
- Replace outdoor lights with yellow bug lights to attract fewer bugs
- Eliminate standing water in rain gutters, buckets, and in tires where pests can breed

GLUTEN-FREE TEX-MEX CHEESE DIP

Plan to double this recipe for a crowd because this addicting cheesy dip is going disappear fast. Go the extra mile and top with pickled jalapeños and/or additional beans and corn.

Published on September 22, 2020 (Better Homes and Garden)

Total Time: 30 mins

Yield: about 3 1/2 cups dip

Ingredients

- 1 8-ounce pkg. cream cheese, cut up
- ½ cup sour cream
- ½ cup mayonnaise
- 1 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese with jalapeño peppers (4 oz.)
- 1 tablespoon gluten-free taco seasoning or 2 tsp. chili powder
- 1 cup canned black beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 cup frozen corn, thawed.
- 1 4 ounce can diced green chile peppers, drained, or 2 Tbsp. finely chopped pickled jalapeño peppers
- Assorted dippers

Directions

- 1. In a medium saucepan stir together cream cheese, sour cream, and mayonnaise. Stir in shredded cheese and taco seasoning.
- 2. Cook and stir over medium-low heat until mixture is melted and smooth. Stir in beans, corn, and chile peppers, heat through. Serve with dippers.

If you're not serving this dip immediately (or toting it to a party), transfer to a 1 1/2-qt. slow cooker. Keep warm, covered, on warm or low up to 2 hours, stirring occasionally.



Butter pecan cottage cheese ice cream

Ingredients

- 3 tablespoons butter
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1 cup pecans, coarsely chopped
- 16 ounces full-fat cottage cheese
- 1/4 cup honey
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

Directions

In a small skillet or saucepan, melt the butter over medium-low heat and add the sugar, stirring until well mixed. Add the pecans and stir to coat, then cook about 5 minutes, stirring frequently and watching to make sure the nuts don't burn.

Remove from heat and set aside until cool.

Place the cottage cheese, honey and vanilla in a food processor and puree until smooth. Pour into a loaf pan and place in the freezer for 1 hour.

Remove from freezer and add the pecan mixture, stirring until it's mixed well and smoothed back out. Return to the freezer for 3 hours longer. Let stand about 10 minutes at room temperature before scooping.

Yield: 4 (1/2-cup) servings. Per serving: 447 calories; fat 32.8 g (8.9 g saturated fat, 0.5 g transfat); 40.7 mg cholesterol; 332.9 mg sodium; 28.1 g carbohydrates; 14.3 g protein.




A Message from Mark, our Maintenance Man.

I want to point out that there is a lot of poison ivy mixed in with regular vegetation. For example, what looks like a patch of the 5-leaf Virginia Creeper, actually has poison ivy mixed in through it. We are in the process of eliminating as much poison ivy as possible.

Areas of the highest concentration of poison ivy include the valley between Lafayette and Adams Circle and crawling up trees and utility poles on the dirt road (Coquina Rd) leading up to the Pier and Compound.

Be careful when walking paths, especially along Little River Drive.

BE MINDFUL of the plant life your dog gets in to.



Can I get poison oak from my dog?

You can get poison oak from your dog. The poison oak oil easily transfers from your dog's fur to your skin where it can cause the classic itchy allergic reaction. Good preventative measures are to scope out your hikes and avoid areas where you see poison oak.

Pets and Poison Ivy, Oak, and Sumac

Poison ivy, oak, and sumac contain a type of sap or oil called urushiol that may trigger an allergic reaction when it comes in contact with the skin.

The fragile leaves of these plants make it easy for the oil to be released when brushing against the leaves. Urushiol is also found on the stems and berries of these plants. The oil can also remain on fabrics and other objects for a long time, allowing exposure down the road.

Animals may become exposed to it by walking through the plants and getting the plant oil on their coats and skin. Fortunately, dogs and cats rarely experience allergic reactions from urushiol. This is mainly because their coats protect their skin from exposure to the oil and their skin is not usually sensitive to the oils in the way humans are.
