There are several committee chairs needed. You must be a member in good standing and fill out the application below.

Committee Chairs Open and explanations of committee as per the bylaws:

Architectural—shall advise the Board of Directors (BOD) as to all structures to be constructed on the property to assure style, size, etc., is in keeping with the overall plan of development. The Board will approve or disapprove plans and specifications as provided in the Declaration of Restrictions after giving consideration to the opinion of the committee.

Budget & Finance—shall prepare an annual expense budget and projected revenue report and advise the BOD as to the status of POA finances.

General Advisory—shall consist of two members from each of the three sections within the subdivision. It is to report to the other committees and the BOD on any area. It shall hold meetings from time to time as its members shall determine.

Nominating—shall compile a list of qualified nominees for the BOD and shall place those names in nomination at the regular April meeting of the BOD. Nominations can be made from the floor or by petition providing nominees are qualified and consent to run.

The board also needs a secretary and Treasurer.

The Secretary shall be ex officio of the Board of Directors, unless he/she shall be in fact a member of the Board of Directors, then his/her position shall not be ex officio. He/she shall record the notes and keep the minutes of all proceedings in a book to be kept for the purpose. He/she shall keep records of the Association. He/she shall maintain a record of all members of the Association together with their addresses as registered by such members.

The Treasurer or Office Administrator shall receive and deposit in appropriate bank accounts all monies of the Association and shall disburse such funds as directed by resolution of the Board of Directors, provided however, that a resolution of the Board of Directors shall not be necessary for disbursements made in the ordinary course of business conducted within the limits of the budget adopted by the membership. The Treasurer shall keep proper books of account. All checks must be signed by two officers of the Association, at least one of whom shall be either the President or the Treasurer.

The office of Secretary/Treasurer may be held by the same person. No one person shall simultaneously hold more than one of any of the other offices except in case of special appointments.

Article X, Item 1 of the ByLaws states the BOD shall appoint chairpersons for committees following the Annual Meeting in July. The BOD requests anyone who would like to serve as chairperson of a committee to fill out and turn in an application. This includes all current chairpersons serving who wish to be considered to continue to serve. The new BOD will make their decisions accordingly based on the applications received.
