On a related but also different note, here are some thoughts about how Blues music and our faith intersect.

Historically, in many ways, the blues has given voice to the lament of a suffering people. For example - "Crazy Blues" by Mamie Smith, which was recorded in the wake of horrific violence against African-Americans in the early 1920's. Lament is also reflected throughout the Bible. Read Psalm 13, for example.

Like many stories in our Scriptures, people can relate to the blues. And as singer and guitarist Susan Tedeschi says, "It moves you. It can help to heal you. I think the blues can be very beneficial on a medicinal level."



Today, the focus of much of our culture has been about making life as easy as possible, and in turn, we have a tendency to become desensitized to the cry of pain and lament from others whose lives are scarred by injustice in our own communities and around the world.

Our calling as people of faith is to rediscover those parts of our rich faith and our sacred text that awaken us to the lament of the world. We need to

> hear Jesus' blessing of those who mourn, for example. Mourning for the cry of pain in the world is an essential part of our faith. And so, the blues can help awaken us to that cry of pain, not only from African Americans and others in our own country, but from communities all around the world.

> But that's not the whole story. The blues also point us to a hope for a better day. "There Must Be a Better World Somewhere" by B.B.

King, for example. And that's where we have another intersection with the blues and the gospel. It's not a hope for a kind of escape to some celestial place when we die. It's the hope that God is constantly in the business of transforming the world...today - with hope, joy, compassion, peace, love. This is what the New Testament talks about, AND of which we get to be a part, in both little and big ways - co-creating a world where that becomes more and more a reality. This is what Jesus meant when he told his followers to be peace-makers, shalom-makers - those who will embody and demonstrate God's work of peace, justice, wholeness for all people. May it be so with us.

#### **Summer Bible Study Series**

The last Wednesday in this monthly series will be held on August 14 beginning with a light supper at 5:30 and study to follow. The series is entitled "After certainty: A biblical guide". A global pandemic, political upheaval, a changing climate... these days, the future is more uncertain than it has ever been. Or is it? For the people of the Bible, life was often shaped by deep uncertainty. Encounters with God sparked awe, confusion or courage, but rarely certainty. Instead, God's people have always been called to follow God into the unknown, trusting in God's certain grace and love. This threesession summer Bible study has been exploring God's invitation to the people of the Bible and to us, to take the holy journey beyond certainty to curiosity, community and compassion, where we find abundant life in Christ.

<u>August's Bible Study theme: After certainty</u> -<u>Compassion</u>. When certainty becomes judgmentalism, it contributes to divisions between people and within communities. The teachings of Jesus and the writings of the apostle Paul sometimes urge people to choose compassion over 'correctness' – a model that can offer Christians guidance in a polarized time. Can this be any more timely?! The August study will be led by Pastor Donna Putney from Trinity Lutheran in Grove City. We meet in the Fellowship Hall at Nordland. Everyone is welcome!
