TREES-SHRUBS-WOODY VINES

Aesculus octandra -Ohio Buckeye

A small sized tree (9 m/ 40 ft) with a broad rounded crown. It produces clusters of yellow flowers in the spring and clusters of nuts in the fall which are toxic to humans. Autumn colour is red/orange. Prefers a sheltered area with well-drained, moist, loam soil and full sun. Water well the first few years. It attracts pollinators including long-tongued bees, bumble bees, hummingbirds and small animals.

Asimina triloba-Paw Paw

A small tree/shrub, 11 m/ 36 ft tall, with large leaves. The large flowers are deep purple/maroon. It has edible fruit with a tropical flavour. Two trees are needed to produce fruit. The tree is resistant to deer, and other animals. Prefers full sun. Pawpaw is the host plant of the zebra swallowtail butterfly.

Ceanothus americanus-New Jersey Tea

New Jersey Tea is a compact, 1 m/ 3 ft flowering shrub. It prefers full sun but can thrive in partial shade. It needs a well-drained site and once established it is drought resistant. Has fragrant, white flowers in spring and attracts hummingbirds, bees and other pollinators. The dried leaves were a popular substitute for English tea during the US revolution.

<p>Cephalanthus occidentalis-Buttonbush This deciduous multi stem shrub can grow to 3 m/ 10 ft and has large glossy dark green leaves. The fragrant, white flowers appear June to September. Buttonbush is suited to wet soils and prefers shade to full sun. It will attract birds, butterflies and bees.</p>	 <p style="text-align: center;">Cephalanthus occidentalis - Buttonbush</p>
<p>Morella pensylvanica-Northern Bayberry This deciduous multi stem shrub grows to 4.5 m/ 15 ft. tall. Prefers full to partial sun and does well in loam or sandy acidic soil. Flowers in the spring with greyish blue berries in the fall. Will tolerate wet conditions. Male and female plants needed to produce the berries.</p>	 <p style="text-align: center;">Morella (syn. <p>Clematis virginiana-Virgin’s Bower This deciduous 5 m/16 ft. vine has white flowers appearing in July to August. The vine can spread from wind-blown seeds. A trellis or support will be needed. Prefers part shade to full sun and moist loam soil. Attracts butterflies and bees.</p>	 <p style="text-align: center;">Clematis virginiana-Virgin’s Bower</p>

PERENNIALS

<p>Allium cernuum-Nodding Onion This is a native perennial bulb in the Amaryllis family. It is drought-tolerant and easy to grow. The plant will grow .6 m/ 1-2 ft tall with long grass-like foliage. Prefers full sun to partial shade. In June to Aug, clusters of pink flowers appear and are attractive to pollinators. Easy to propagate by dividing the bulblets.</p>	 <p style="text-align: center;">Allium cernuum – Nodding Onion</p>

Asclepias incarnata-Swamp Milkweed

An upright .5-1.5m/2-5 ft. tall perennial plant which likes sun to part shade. Displays showy, fragrant flowers in pink and purple that bloom from June to October. All parts are toxic in large quantities. Host plant for the Monarch butterfly. Likes moist soil and will tolerate heavy clay.

Asclepias tuberosa Butterfly Milkweed

A 30-61cm/1-2 ft. tall perennial herb with orange and yellow flowers which bloom from July to September. Prefers full sun exposure and is drought tolerant. Roots and plant sap are poisonous. Host to Monarch larvae. Nectar source to butterflies and hummingbirds.

Chelone glabra-White Turtlehead

½ -1m/1-4 ft. tall with flowers shaped like a turtlehead. Blooms are white starting in July through to September. Likes sun, part shade with moist or wet soil. Attracts butterflies, hummingbirds and the Baltimore Checkerspot.

Echinacea pallida-Pale coneflower

This attractive pale lavender perennial blooms starting in July. Attracts bees and butterflies. The height is 1 to 1.5m/ 3 to 5 ft and grows best in full sun and prefers average soil conditions.

Eupatorium maculatum-Spotted Joe-Pye Weed

Joe Pye Weed is a popular showy perennial growing up to 2 m 6 ft. in July and August. The flowers are pink and provide nectar for a variety of butterflies. Will grow in sun or shade and most soil conditions.

Hibiscus moscheutos-Swamp rose Mallow

A taller perennial at 1.5 to 2 m/4 to 6 ft. producing white to pink flowers from July to September. Needs full sun and doesn't like to dry out so medium to wet soil conditions. Great plant to attract butterflies.

Iris virginica-Southern Blue Flag Iris

A clumping iris with foliage growing to 50-60 cm/ 20-24 in. in height and width at maturity. In mid-June flower stalks emerge that support pale blue flowers. Best grown in full sun and adapts well to wet areas. Great for planting adjacent to a water feature.

Liatris aspera-Rough Blazing Star

A small clumping prairie perennial with narrow, grass-like leaves at the base. Flower spikes emerge in late summer and grow from 60-90 cm/ 24-25 in. in height. Purple flowers open first at the top of the flower spike and work their way down over time. Needs full sun and a well-drained soil. The flowers are a magnet for butterflies, especially Monarchs.

Monarda fistulosa-Wild Bergamot

This perennial will thrive in any soil provided it has full sun. It will tolerate light shade but flowering will be lighter. Wild Bergamot grows to 60–80cm/24-31in. in height and will spread over time. Lavender coloured flowers appear in mid to late summer and are attractive to hummingbirds and many butterflies. The foliage is pleasantly scented.

Pycnanthemum virginianum-Virginia Mountain Mint

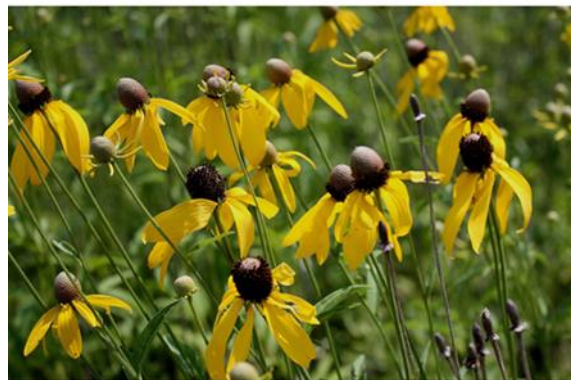
Aromatic perennial with narrow, gray-green leaves. Summer bloomer with an abundance of small white flowers with dots of lavender. These are small insect and butterfly attractors. Their height is 24-36in.(60-90cm) They thrive in full sun to part shade, and any type of soil. Do not do well in dry conditions.

Ratibida pinnata-Grey-headed Coneflower

Tall perennial with yellow drooping ray flowers that has a brown/greenish cone in the centre. Their height is 1 to 1.5m/3 to 5 ft. They attract butterflies and do well in poor soil. They require low water and full sun.

Senna hebecarpa-Wild Senna

Shrubby herbaceous perennial that grows to 1.5m/ 5 ft and has clusters of brown/yellow pea like flowers which bloom in the summer. The seed heads provide winter interest. They require full sun and average, well-drained soil. This plant provides food for the Sulphur butterfly and pollen for bees.

Silphium laciniatum-Compass Plant

A tall, slow-growing, plant which can grow up to 2-2.5m/ 6 -10 ft. It has yellow composite flowers and large, beautifully patterned leaves. Tolerates poor soil and is resistant to drought. Grows best in full sun and attracts bees and butterflies.

Solidago rigida-Stiff Goldenrod

Great plant for the garden growing up to 1 m 3 ft. Widely adaptable, thrives in inhospitable soils, from clay to dry sand. Golden yellow flowers in late Summer-Autumn. Relatively pest free. A favourite of pollinators, Monarch butterflies and songbirds.

Symphotrichum novae-angliae New England Aster

Bold, bright perennial growing up to 1-2m/3-6 ft. Prefers full sun and will tolerate any type of soil. Blooming period is August to October with purple showy flowers. It is deer and rabbit resistance. Great plant to attract butterflies and bees.

Vernonia gigantea-Tall Ironweed

Tall Ironweed is a narrow clump forming perennial with clusters of fluffy purple flowers in late summer, early fall. Grows to 2m/6 ft. & 1m/3-4ft. wide. Prefers sun to part shade. Attracts birds, butterflies and native bees.

Veronicastrum virginicum-Culver's Root

A very showy, hardy perennial with long, white spikes that can be white to shades of pink, blooms from summer to fall. Grows 1m 3 to 4ft. in full sun or light shade and takes a few years to establish. Attracts bees and butterflies.

Gentiana andrewsii-Closed Bottle Gentian

Bottle gentian is a beautiful, showy wildflower that blooms August through October with 1.5-inch violet, sometimes white, closed terminal cluster flowers. Smaller flowers can be present in the axils of the upper tier of leaves. Only strong bees can force the corolla open in order to get at the nectar and deposit pollen. The plant itself is 1-3 foot tall with a non-branching stem. It grows in moist, rich soils either in full or partial sun.

Geum triflorum- Prairie Smoke

it prefers sunny, well-drained soils such as grassy fields but also withstands light shade such as at the edge of woodlands. In Ontario, it also lives in habitats called alvars, the thin soil that accumulates atop limestone bedrock, such as in the Bruce Peninsula. It's classed as endangered here. The red or pink bracts that conceal a tiny flower at the central tip are pretty in themselves. But the real show comes from the fluffy seed heads. It prefers dry to medium moist soils that are sandy loam, loam and has a mature height about 6".

Tall and showy, pink-purple blooms which last most of the summer. Enjoy watching Monarchs and other insects coming for a nectar drink along their journey. Requires more moisture than the shorter Cylindrical Blazing Star. A great plant for full sun locations. Should not be over fertilized. Excellent as a cut flower.
