26. What kind of dog food do you intend to feed your foster and are you able to purchase food and/or supplies for the foster?

27. Are you able to transport the foster to/from vet appointments if needed?

28. Have you ever sold, given away, or surrendered a pet to a shelter/rescue?

29. Please tell us why you want to foster a dog.

30. Please tell us a little about your lifestyle and your family including any special activities in which your dog would be included.

31. Please provide 3 references with name, e-mail address, and phone numbers.

By applying to become a foster, you understand the following:

- While outside the home, the foster dog is to be doubled-leashed at all times. This means that the dog must have martingale-type collar with leash as well as a slip-lead. If fostering puppies, they are not allowed off your property. Any dogs with fearful behavior are not allowed to leave your property for at least one week other than required vet appointments. This will allow the dog to decompress. During decompression, it is important that they are not allowed to interact with other dogs and are given an area to themselves where they can be alone without other dogs or people around.
- While the dog remains in foster care, the dog is still the legal property of the rescue group in which it was pulled under. Therefore, all final decisions regarding the welfare of the animal will be the responsibility of this rescue. You must stay in communication with rescue. Any vetting emergencies that arise will be communicated to the rescue immediately. Should the foster dog need veterinary care, the rescue will handle the scheduling and payment of the appointment. Please note, the rescue keeps many of the most common medications and supplements on hand and will provide as necessary.
- While fostering for the above rescue or any of their assorted partner rescues, you may not take in any other animals either by adoption or foster without prior approval from the rescue.
- It is your obligation and understanding that this dog legally belongs to the rescue, and you are responsible for making the dog available to the rescue upon request.
- Submission and approval of this foster application does not guarantee an adoption approval from the rescue. Should you be interested in adopting your foster dog, you must first notify the rescue and adoption discussion will be held at that time. You understand and agree that fostering does not reduce or remove any fee associated with adopting the foster dog.
- Should you need the dog removed from your care, you must notify the rescue immediately. The rescue will try to find placement within 24 hours, but it may take up to 2 days to find the right placement. You agree to continue fostering the dog until that time has elapsed and to help in transporting the dog to the new foster location.

- The rescue maintains the right to remove the dog from your care at any time for any reason.

By submitting this application for consideration, you agree to abide by the policies and procedures of the rescue groups and SC Rescue Partners listed above and attest that the information provided on this application is true and accurate to the best of your knowledge.
