

Baigali & Dancers

Baigali, a member of the Urad tribe from Inner Mongolia, China, holds a B.A. in Dance from Minzu University, an MFA in Choreography and Dance Directing from the Mongolian University of Art and Culture, and a Master's in Dance Education from New York University.

She has won top honors in competitions such as the Lotus Cup and Taoli Cup, and taught at leading institutions including the Primary School Affiliated to Capital Normal University and Beijing Institute of Fashion Technology. In the U.S., she has guest lectured at NYU Steinhardt and Manhattan Public High School, where her classes were warmly received.

Her professional work includes serving as Chief Director and choreographer for the 2019 Inner Mongolia Spring Festival Gala and as a judge in a fashion model competition in Hohhot, China. In 2021, she established her dance company, Baigali and Dancers, dedicated to bringing original choreography to the stage. In 2024, the company's debut showcase Thriving at the Sunnyvale Theater was a resounding success, with audience members calling it the best performance by amateur dancers they had seen in decades.

Baigali's teaching is rigorous yet holistic, combining flexibility, strength, and technique with aesthetics and emotional expression. With her systematic approach, she inspires every student—amateur or aspiring professional—to unlock their fullest potential in dance. https://baigalianddancers.com/

Erin Akrobetu

Born and raised in Jackson, MS, Erin received her BFA in dance from Belhaven University. While in college, she had the opportunity to work with artists such as Cynthia Newland, Caleb Mitchell, Ravenna Tucker, Laura Morton, Stephen Wynne, David Keary, Steve Rooks, Randall Flinn, and Emily Wright. During her senior year, Erin was accepted into Alvin Ailey's summer intensive where she spent 6 weeks training in Horton, Graham, and Ballet. Following college, Erin moved to Cleveland, OH to dance with Inlet Dance Theatre as a Company Member, Choreographer, and Teaching Artist. During her 8 years with Inlet, Erin had the opportunity to perform throughout the United States and premier new works at the second largest Playhouse Square, located in Cleveland, as well as performing at Jacob's Pillow's Inside/Out Series. After moving to the Bay Area in 2021, Erin danced as a company member for sjDANCEco, under the direction of Gary Masters and Maria Basile. She has held masterclasses in Erick Hawkins technique and Non-Traditional Partnering at Belhaven University, Hillsdale College, and University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire. She has over 15 years of teaching experience in ballet, modern, improvisation, and non-traditional partnering.

Katerina Bousleli / Feng Ye Dance Studio

Aikaterini (Katerina) Bousleli, born in Greece is a dancer, choreographer, and educator based in the Bay Area. She has performed in Revolution is a Dinner Party at the Palo Alto Art Center and presented work at the D.I.R.T. Festival (San Francisco) and the SpARC Dance Festival (San Jose). As a choreographer, she has created works for San Francisco State University (Iketis, OikoSystem) and the Feng Ye Youth Dance Ensemble (Blue, IDeal), with performances at the Pear Theatre and Mission Dance Theatre.

Previously, she performed widely in Greece with AniMotus Dance Company, ReDance, Faos, and b.area 4, and appeared at festivals such as Reload and Pocket Dance Festival.

She is currently a Dance Faculty Lecturer at San Francisco State University and holds an M.A. in Theatre Arts and a B.A. in Greek Philology.

Monica Espinosa

Monica is a UX researcher, dancer, and circus artist. Born and raised in Monterrey, NL, Mexico. She danced jazz in Monterrey, at Le Jazz Ballet Studio from the age of 5 up until she was 17 years old; she started dancing again only two years ago at Zohar Dance Company. She has been doing Cyr wheel for about 3 years. She likes to explore different ways of combining dance, movement, and the circus arts. This is her first performance with her wheel. When she is not exploring movement, Monica works as a UX researcher at a medical device company called Intuitive, company that designs and manufactures the da Vinci surgical robot.



MoveSpeakSpin

Karl Schaffer directs Santa Cruz based dancers in MoveSpeakSpin, a Santa Cruz based dance ensemble co-directed by Schaffer and Erik Stern since 1987. They have toured throughout North America and to Europe and Asia and have received five grants from the National Endowment for the Arts for their math and dance integration work. "Dr. Jones," "Trio for Six," and "Sophie Germain" are three sections of the concert Nevertheless She Persisted which celebrates the lives and work of important women mathematicians. "Trio for Six" was co-choreographed by Schaffer, Scott Kim, and Barbara Susco, and was created in the 1990s. Schaffer's recent work includes the 2025 show Calculated Movements on resistance to the current political situation in the United States, Pitter Pattern, exploring beautiful and enchanting patterns in dance, rhythm, and shape, and Nevertheless She Persisted. Schaffer and Stern are designated Teaching Artists with the Kennedy Center. Schaffer's choreography often links dance, mathematics, and social justice issues, and he has published widely on these connections. https://movespeakspin.com/

Natasha Carlitz Dance Ensemble

Founded in 2005, the Natasha Carlitz Dance Ensemble presented its inaugural concert in partnership with the internationally acclaimed California Guitar Trio and since then has produced twelve more full-length programs as well as appearing in dozens of showcases and festivals around the Bay Area. Athletic and spirited, NCDE dancers bring both strong technique and emotional depth to their performances.

With its strong focus on musicality, the company has commissioned work from a number of composers and seizes opportunities to perform with live musicians, including two invitations from folk-rock duo Emma's Revolution. "Serious and graceful work... displays creativity and talent that are worth seeing... One of the really successful features of Carlitz' work is that the selected music and choreography fit so well together," writes Michael Phelan of baydance.com.

San Jose Dance Theatre

San Jose Dance Theatre was originally founded in 1964 as Paul E. Curtis Jr.'s Los Gatos Academy of Dance and the West Valley Ballet Foundation. The name was later changed to San Jose Dance Theatre in 1965 and incorporated as a nonprofit educational organization. For more than 58 years, San Jose Dance Theatre has specialized in classical ballet training for children from four years of age, to the advanced pre-professional level. Many SJDT alumni have gone on to prominent University and Conservatory programs, as well as successful careers in dance.

San Jose Dance Theatre has delighted local audiences for six decades with performances including Cinderella, Alice in Wonderland, The Little Mermaid, The Wizard of Oz & Sleeping Beauty. In December 2025, we will celebrate our 60th annual production of The Original San Jose Nutcracker at the San Jose Center for the Performing Arts. https://www.sjdt.org/

Her passion and talent soon led her to Pacific Northwest Ballet, where she progressed through every level before continuing her training under the private mentorship of Deborah Hadley. At just 16, Cassidy joined Grand Rapids Ballet, where she danced professionally for eight seasons. She is now based in San Francisco and performs with Smuin Contemporary Ballet, where she continues to grow as an artist, educator, and choreographer.

Cassidy has been choreographing since her teens and brings a deep love for teaching into every studio she enters. She has worked with both competition-focused studios and pre-professional ballet schools, giving her a versatile and well-rounded approach to coaching young dancers. Specializing in contemporary, she is passionate about guiding students beyond their comfort zones and helping them unlock their full potential.
