THE NEED FOR BOYS & GIRLS CLUB

The hours between 3:00 PM and 6:00 PM are the most influential in a child's life. These are the hours when parents are working, school is out, and many children are without adult supervision. During this "out of school time", youth are left to find their own forms of recreation and amusement in their neighborhoods and communities. Some children are at greater risk during this time of following the wrong leaders and can be influenced into making poor decisions.

The Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) reports that the incidence of violent crimes committed by youth peaks in the hours immediately following the end of the school day, with close to 1 in 5 juvenile violent crimes taking place in the hours between 3 and 7 p.m. Additionally, more than one-fifth of violent crimes involving youth as victims occurs during the same

These risks are not restricted to a specific group. Every child from every family in every community is "at risk" of becoming involved in delinquent behavior or being affected by someone engaged in delinquent behavior. Children at most risk of delinquent behavior, are those who have economic barriers that prevent them from participating in structured,

well supervised after-school or summer programs.

To increase children's chances of becoming productive citizens and reduce their opportunities of engaging in delinquent behavior they need to have access to after-school programs like the Boys & Girls Club.

Research confirms that afterschool programs' impact

and influence has progressed beyond acting solely as a safe haven for youth in the community. Afterschool programs are helping students tackle challenging circumstances and avoid risky behaviors, teaching kids how to communicate effectively with their peers and interact positively with others, and encouraging them to believe in themselves—helping them develop fortitude and persevere through difficult situations they may face.

Since 2001 the Boys & Girls Club of Bulloch County has had a positive influence on the lives of thousands of local children. Children engage in a variety of age appropriate programs in; Academic Enrichment, Career Development, Health, Nutrition, Character Development, Art and Recreation.

The Boys & Girls Club, its staff, volunteers and supporters are having a positive impact of our community by improving the chance for local children to have a successful and productive future.


