



We recently had a celebration in which we gave each other cards which was both joyful and meaningful. While we made them, we put some worship music on and spent time creating with Holy Spirit!







This art piece has many layers. I'll explain some of the steps I did to make it and that might give you some ideas to use in your own art or creative time!

First I used a blue runny paint in a spray bottle on the very back of my canvas/paper. Next I created another runny paint, this time purple, and used a pipette to create drip lines. I mixed a little water with my paint and stirred it a lot to make a runnier paint.

After I created the background and let it dry, I started on the rose. I used a pencil to lightly sketch the rose onto the canvas.

Then I used a special paste called texture paste to create a 3D effect for the rose's petals. After the texture paste had dried, I painted the rose in layers.

Now, over to you to try out some of these techniques in your own art! Have fun and invite Holy Spirit into your process.



Creative Cooking






One of our favourite lunches to make is banana pancakes. They only have a few simple ingredients, are pretty quick to make and are very yummy! Try these in your own home with help from an adult.

INCREDIENTS

- 2 medium-sized bananas
- 4 eggs
- 2 heaped tablespoons of arrowroot or tapioca starch

Olive oil or coconut oil for cooking
Optional: 1 teaspoon of vanilla essence
Toppings of your choice (maple syrup is ours)



METHOD

Step 1:

Peel and blitz two bananas in a blender or food processor. If you don't have one, you can mash them with a fork or potato masher into a bowl.

Step 2:

Crack four eggs into a mug and add them to the bananas. Add the arrowroot or tapioca starch and mix well in the blender or by hand in your bowl until the mixture is pretty smooth. Add your vanilla essence now (optional) and mix.





Step 3:

Turn on the hotplate and drizzle on the olive oil or coconut oil to heat up. When the oil is hot, place mixture onto the hot pan in pikelet sizes using a spoon or ladle.

When you can see the edges going brown, flip over the pancake and cook for a further ten seconds. Remove from the hot pan, add new pancakes and continue cooking until mixture is gone.

Step 4:

Add toppings and enjoy warm or cold!

The King of the land of Persia, King Xerxes, was looking for a new Queen after his previous Queen had dishonoured him. A royal decree had gone out that had banished Queen Vashti from his presence. A new Queen was being sought for the royal position as the King's decree was law.

Esther was a Hebrew girl who was raised in the land of Persia by her cousin Mordecai. After her parents died, they had left Esther to the care of Mordecai, a good Hebrew man.

A new law soon went out that all the beautiful young unmarried women of the land should be gathered and given beauty treatments to see who would become King Xerxes' new Queen. As Esther was very lovely and beautiful, she was taken to the palace to have the beauty treatments. Esther found favour with Hegai, the custodian of the women in the palace. After this, King Xerxes promoted a man named Haman, who was an Agagite, the direct descendants of the enemy of the Hebrew people. The king trusted Haman but Haman was a bad man. After Mordecai would not bow to him, Haman was very angry and plotted to kill Mordecai and all the Hebrew people. Haman went to the king and told him a lie, that there was a group of people that were a threat to him and he (Haman) would pay for them to be destroyed. The king did not know that it was the Hebrew people, who his descendants had helped save. Haman had hidden information from him to get him to agree.

Mordecai asked Esther to go to the king to tell him the truth. However, if Esther went to the king without being asked and if he didn't extend his golden scepter to her, she could be killed. 

Activities








Movies, books, podcasts and music to help encourage, grow you or create discussions in your family


