

2026 ATE-Indiana Grant Descriptions

Duaine Lang Research Grant

- ATE-I members are encouraged to submit a request for a research grant for up to \$500. This grant is available for the 2026-2027 academic year.
- To apply for an ATE-I Duaine Lang Research Grant, please submit the following:
 - Letter of application
 - Formal proposal for the project/research (the proposal must include the project's objectives, significance, budget and its justification, and individuals involved)
- Proposals will be reviewed by the members of the Publications and Research Committee. The criteria by which proposals will be judged include:
 - Significance of the projects to the profession of education and/or teacher education, particularly benefiting the state of Indiana.
 - Quality of research/project, i.e., is it manageable in the amount of time specified.
 - Appropriateness as a "reasonable" investment for ATE-I research related to student teaching supervision is highly encouraged.
- Grant recipients will be expected to do the following:
 - Complete the project/research by the end of the 2026-2027 academic year.
 - Prepare a brief report (2-3 pages) about the project/research and specific accounting of the grant funds for the Publications and Research Committee no later than May 20, 2027.
 - Present the findings of the project/research at the 2027 ATE-I Fall Conference.

Mini Grant

- ATE-I members are encouraged to submit a request for a research grant for up to \$500. This grant is available for the 2026-2027 academic year.
- To apply for an ATE-I Mini Grant, please submit the following:
 - Letter of application
 - Formal proposal for the project/research (the proposal must include the project's objectives, significance, budget and its justification, and individuals involved)
- Proposals will be reviewed by the members of the Publications and Research Committee. The criteria by which proposals will be judged include:
 - Significance of the projects to the profession of education and/or teacher education, particularly benefiting the state of Indiana.
 - Quality of research/project, i.e., is it manageable in the amount of time specified.
 - Appropriateness as a "reasonable" investment for ATE-I
- The Publications and Research Committee will tend not to support conference travel
- Individuals are encouraged to seek institutional support for nominal administrative costs (e.g., duplication and postage) and are asked to report any additional funding they have received for the research project.
- Grant recipients will be expected to do the following:
 - Complete the project/research by the end of the 2026-2027 academic year.
 - Prepare a brief report (2-3 pages) about the project/research and specific accounting of the grant funds for the Publications and Research Committee no later than May 20, 2027.
 - Present the findings of the project/research at the 2027 ATE-I Fall Conference.
