

Aaron Rosen serves as President and Founder of the World Affairs Council of Miami, where he is responsible for standing up the Council and executing its programs, development, and strategic vision. He is a Term Member of the Council on Foreign Relations and a 2024 Eisenhower Fellow, during which he researched disinformation, media literacy, and democratic resilience in Eastern and Northern Europe. Prior to founding the World Affairs Council of Miami, Aaron researched international technology policy and Russian affairs with the Alfa Fellowship Program in Moscow. He previously worked as a Washington, D.C.-based specialist in U.S. foreign policy for MUFG Bank, formerly the Bank of Tokyo-Mitsubishi UFJ, and completed a graduate fellowship with the European Parliament in Brussels.

Aaron has experience working with various legislative and diplomatic bodies, including the U.S. Congress, German Bundestag, Australian House of Representatives, Canadian House of Commons, Luxembourg Chamber of Deputies, Embassy of Mexico in the United States, and the European Parliament Liaison Office to the U.S. Congress.

Aaron earned a dual masters in U.S. foreign policy and international history from the George Washington University and the London School of Economics, and holds a bachelors in international relations and comparative politics from the University of Central Florida.
