# MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

The Foster Kidd Foundation, dba Pro-Duffers Foundation was created in 2004 as the philanthropic arm of the Pro-Duffers SW Chapter. We support and promote the development of self-esteem, academic excellence, character and sportsmanship among young people. We also support other deserving community organizations and non-profit organizations. In addition, the Foster Kidd Foundation awards scholarships to deserving students to attend college in order to assist in achieving potential life goals.

Although we accept donations year-round, we sponsor three signature events in June each year as our major fundraising effort to support our Programs and work in the community. Every dollar collected goes to support our Programs because we carry no overhead costs. This past year we were able to award \$50,000 dollars in scholarships to students at Paul Quinn College. Furthermore, in support of our mission we went to Austin for the 86th Legislative Session to advocate for passage of legislation to combat childhood obesity. Finally, the Foster Kidd (Pro-Duffers) Foundation partnered with Minnie's Food Pantry and other organizations to deliver nearly 300 food baskets during our Community Service Day.

#### **Scholarships**
