Atlantic Highlands Navesink Family and Friends,

We only have few topics left to explore. During worship we will cover, "Are You Afraid of the Future?" Next week here in the newsletter we will

cover questions about heaven which will include a conversation about Judish, Muslim, and Christianity. For today, we explore the question, "why does the Lord give some people who are not able to provide for a child, give them his grace and not give to a couple who desperately want a child?"

I think it's important to have some clarity around this question: a child is not God's grace. God's grace is forgiveness which we can, and do, experience at every point of life in one way or another. Grace is entirely independent of one's parental status. A child is not God's grace.

So, why does God give children to those who can't provide for them but doesn't give children to those who desperately want children?

This is a question that is hard to answer. It's one I spend quite a bit of time asking myself. For the roughly 20% of couples who are intentionally looking to conceive, our standard answers do not satisfy the question. Even if you're looking at couples who have experienced infertility and are looking to adopt, there are an estimated of 1-2 million couples waiting in the US alone and roughly 110,000 have completed the adoption process each year. Not to mention the process can be between \$20,000 and \$45,000. There are many couples who are looking to have children and are unable or delayed at becoming parents. There are just as many who have lost children to illness and tragedy.

And yet, there are over \$400,000 children in foster care. Sometimes they are in foster care temporarily as their parents walk through a significant challenge in their personal lives that has impacted their ability to care for their children. Sometimes, reunification never happens. Sometimes, they are orphaned with no additional family willing to take them in. And sometimes, it's because biological parents recognize that they are unable to adequately care for a child.

Often when we talk about children, we say that "children are a gift from God." When someone is experiencing any of this pain, we tell them to "keep on praying." We remind them of the story of Abraham and Sarah who desperately wanted a child, and trusted God to give them one. Their story is one with a

happy ending. But even if those seeking to be parents pray fervently, faithfully serve, and trust in God, they don't always get the child they are hoping for. Even though our current medical technology provides ways for parents to have biological children in ways that we could not expect but not everyone has access to these treatments or a desire to engage in these complex procedures. Plus, illness and tragedy do strike, causing parents to lose their child in utero and after they are born.

This is the moment where it is really important to remember that we live in a world that has been tainted. It is a world in need of redemption, *and* it is actively being redeemed. A part of me wants to say that children go to those who can't seem to provide because of choices that the parents made. Because of those choices, there are children who are not receiving the care they need. So, those children are temporarily removed from the care of their parents while the parents get the help they need. With our gift of free will, this is going to be difficult to change.

That said, the UMC fully supports families and children who are a part of the foster care system as well as those who have made the difficult, and brave, choice to relinquish care of their child because they know that they cannot provide what the child needs. I wonder if part of that redemptive process is when those who can provide for a child, taking in and working with the children and families who reside in the foster system, or outright adoption.

That said, I wonder if the answer to this question is not about God, and more about us. Why don't we, as a society, see non-traditional forms of parenthood as valid options of a family's journey? I know having biological children is a completely different experience than fostering or adoption. I know the process of IVF is entirely different than what we would call natural conception. And some may be saying, "how could someone who hasn't had any of these experiences be speaking about it at all?" This is a question at the forefront of my mind many days because I may one day fall into the category of desperately wanting, but unable to have.

I wonder if it's not a question of God giving, but God responding to people who are hurting and us joining in that response.
