<sup>8</sup> Then Amalek came and fought with Israel at Rephidim. <sup>9</sup> Moses said to Joshua, "Choose some men for us and go out; fight with Amalek. Tomorrow I will stand on the top of the hill with the staff of God in my hand." <sup>10</sup> So Joshua did as Moses told him and fought with Amalek, while Moses, Aaron, and Hur went up to the top of the hill. <sup>11</sup> Whenever Moses held up his hand, Israel prevailed, and whenever he lowered his hand, Amalek prevailed. <sup>12</sup> But Moses's hands grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat on it. Aaron and Hur held up his hands, one on either side, so his hands were steady until the sun set. <sup>13</sup> And Joshua defeated Amalek and his people with the sword. ~Exodus 17:8-13 NRSVUE

In doing my devotions this week, I came across this passage from Exodus. While much of the Old Testament does not fully jive with how I see God in light of the New Testament, namely the war pieces, this is a beautiful reminder of how we are called to be in community with one another. When one person is not able to carry on, others step in to help.

This piece of scripture comes in the middle of the Israelites escaping slavery in Egypt. In the midst of experiencing a lack of food and water, they saw firsthand how God provides. Until they are attacked by the Amalekites, a consistent thorn in their sides. They are told to fight back, but Moses cannot keep up his role in the fight. When he tires, his people begin to suffer. His family and close friend see his exhaustion and step in to help, literally holding him up to allow him to keep up his role in the fight. With their help, the story of God's people continues.

In my sermon a few weeks ago, I mentioned that this concept is much like living in a household with others. When one is not able to function at 100%, the other picks up what they can't. We even talked about how in the church during a season where some need rest, how others will need to pick the pieces so that the church might continue to move forward in building up the kingdom of God.

In seasons of change, we burn out faster than other seasons. In these moments, it takes the whole of the community to love God, to love people, and to welcome all. Your leadership teams are diligently working to find ways to keep Beacon UMC a piece of the kingdom of God for years to come. They are diligently working to discover the ways Beacon can not only build up the community within, but how to step out into the community outside our walls.

I sincerely thank them for their work. But they need your help. I invite you to think about the ways that you might use your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service, and your witness, to lift up the kingdom of God here so that Beacon UMC might continue to discover and live into its role in the fight for love in the world.

appreciate your understanding and prayers as I fulfill this civic duty.


## **Pastor Nicole is away**






