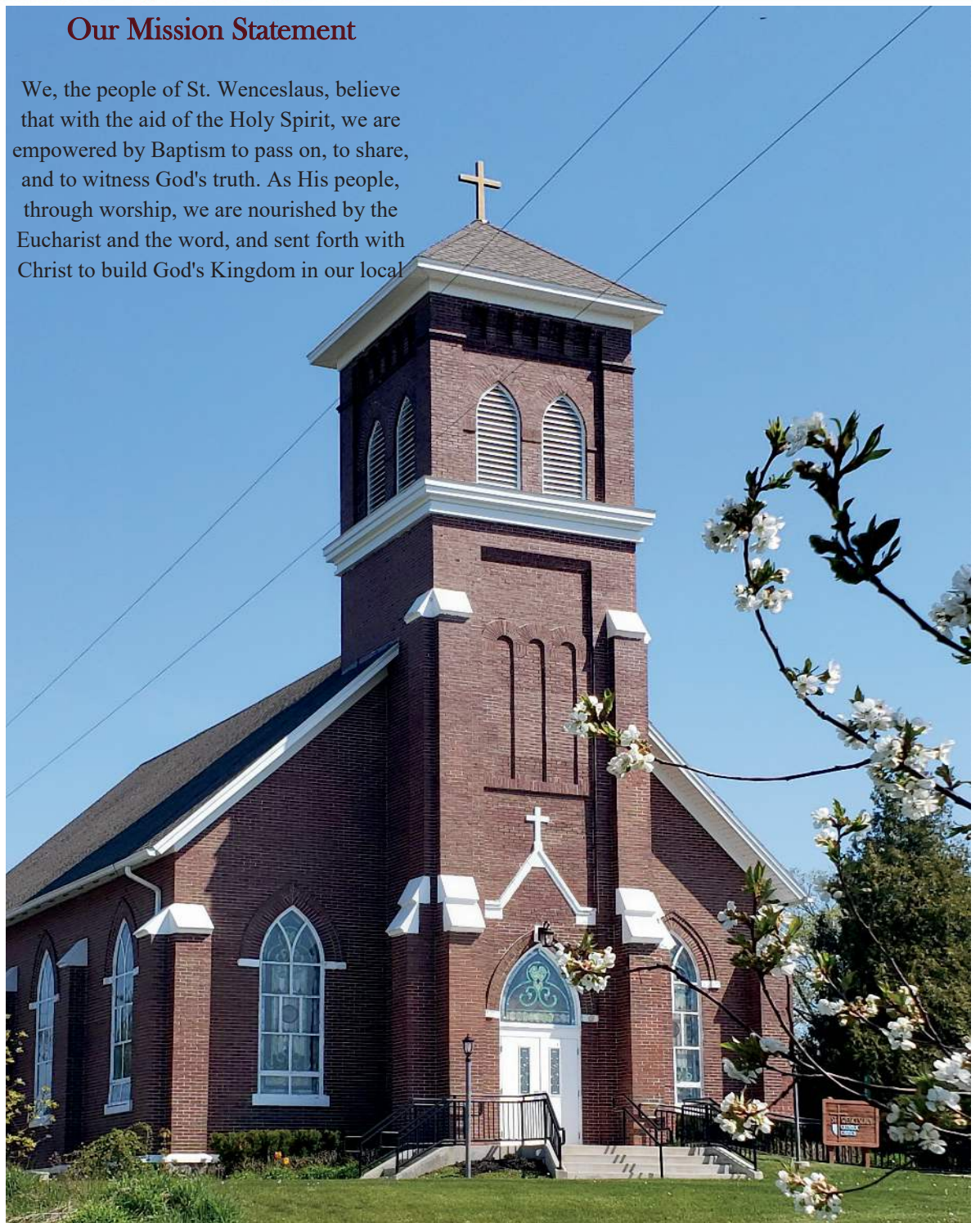

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

In today's liturgy, John 20:1-9, we celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord. On the first day of the week, Mary Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning while it was still dark, and saw the stone rolled away. She runs to Peter and the other disciple and tells them that they have taken the Lord. They hasten to the tomb, Peter went in and saw the burial cloth, and the cloth that covered his head rolled up in a separate place. They did not understand the scripture that He had to rise from the dead.

This is John's narrative, his story. He was there and went into the tomb. He saw the cloth folded up neatly. This was no accident. This was like a divine fingerprint or note from the only One who could work such a miracle. John saw and believed, but did not understand.

We were not there, Yet we believe. We believe because the word was and is handed down by eye witness. And we are to hand it down as well. Not only the risen Lord, but His resurrection, the whole Pascal Mystery, His passion, death, and Resurrection, and His saving of all mankind. This was more than a rising, more than a resuscitation; Jesus would never die again. All the people that Jesus rose from the dead would some day die again. Not so Jesus.

Who could ever imagine that death could be conquered? That's what Easter means. Your death and my death is not the end. Just as Jesus rose from the dead, so will we rise from the dead. Body and soul, we will live forever. Suffering does not have the last word. Death does not have the last word. The love of God, given to us in Jesus Christ has the last word. This is why the Psalm shouts out: "This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad!" Happy Easter and be filled with Joy.
