Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. In the Gospel, Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23, starts after the Magi had departed. An angel appears to Joseph in a dream telling Him to take Mary and Jesus and flee to Egypt. After Herod died, an angel told him to return to the land of Israel. Directed by an angel he settled in Nazareth. That is why Jesus is referred to as a Nazorean.

If we look at the Holy Family and the challenges they had to endure, the many moves they had to make, the new places they had to adapt to, we can see part of their life journey on earth was very challenging. They did not know the end results as we do for them. God had not told them how it would end. When Mary and Joseph were packing their donkey at midnight and sneaking our of town, they probably didn't feel especially glamorous or glorious. When they were traipsing through the desert on their way to Egypt, they probably didn't feel especially heroic. And yet, it was through those difficult and mundane tasks that God was saving the world.

Today, God is reminding us that he wants us to do the same thing in our lives. We all have mundane things to do in our life. We all have bills to pay, sometimes it can be difficult. We may have an unexpected call to travel a distance because a loved one needs us. We make sacrifices for our children to keep them safe and healthy. We help others who are less fortunate with finances. We visit the sick and shut ins. We travel a similar journey as Mary and Joseph. We too should willingly follow Gods plan for us. Our salvation and others salvation depends on us being faithful to it.

Any cleric, religious, employee, school counselor, teacher, administrator or other person acting with the authority of the Church of the Diocese of Gaylord who has reasonable cause to suspect child abuse or neglect of a minor shall comply with State reporting requirements, specifically the Michigan Child Protection Law, MCL 722.263, except for those communications that are canonically privileged. Notification by a staff member to the person in charge of a church, school or other diocesan entity does not relieve the staff member of said church, school or entity of the obligation to report under the Michigan Child Protection Law. All individuals suspecting child abuse, whether they are mandated reporters or not, must immediately contact the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services by telephone at (855)444-3911 or online at https:/bvww.michigan.gov/mdhhs. The Michigan Attorney General's office has also established a special telephone number for people to share information that may be helpful in the ongoing investigation of sexual misconduct. The Michigan Department of Attorney General tip line is (844)324-3374. The Diocese shall post clear instructions on its website with the appropriate contact information to allow any and all individuals who suspect child abuse to make reports to civil authorities and to the Diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator.
