

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today is the first Sunday of Advent. In the Gospel for today, Matthew 24:37-44, Jesus tells His disciples: "As it was in the days of Noah, people were going about their business, up until the flood. So will it be in the time of the coming of the son of man. Therefore stay awake. For you do not know when the Lord will come."

Jesus tells us three things. He will return, we do not know when, and we had better be ready. Why is Jesus telling them these things? Why does the Church remind us about them every year as Advent begins? God wants us to know our time is limited. That our lives and history itself will come to an end. He wants us to know this, because He wants us to use our limited time wisely, living as true Christians. Jesus considers this lesson so important that He dedicates four separate parables to it before He finishes the conversation, driving the lesson home.

Jesus knew how easily, even the most faithful disciples can fall into the trap of thinking that this earthly life is the goal and not merely the path. Human life is a journey. What would you do if Jesus came back to night? What would you say to Him? Because He will come back, and you will meet Him, and we do not know when that last day of our life will be. Now is the time to prepare.


