No shew clothes. Penalties in fact may be imposed for those that kant seem to foller these here simple rules.

Rules/Guidelines

These shows are sanctioned by ALSA and ILR. The shows will run according to rules/guidelines in the ALSA 23rd edition Handbook, and the current edition of ILR Show Division Guidelines. Visit www.alsashow.org to review complete ALSA handbook and www.lamaregistry.com Show Division to review complete ILR handbook. Where a conflict occurs rules and guidelines will follow ILR.

All Ilamas and alpacas 5 months and older are eligible to participate. All animals must be registered with the ILR for Halter classes. Non ILR registered animals participating in ALSA Performance and Adult Non-Breeder classes must have a ALSA tracking number for ALSA classes.or a ILR Tracking number for ILR-SD classes. To obtain tracking number contact ALSA and ILR office

Entry registrations must include ILR number and/or tracking numbers for each animal. ALSA member number, or Youth ALSA number is required. Copies of pending registration must be presented at check-in. **Deadline**: Entries must be postmarked **by April 1, 2025.**

Out of state animals must have a health certificate within 30 days of the show and list any readable microchip number on certificate. 840 Microchips are not required_The certificate must be presented at check-in. Microchips may be read at registration. Michigan llamas and alpacas do not need a health certificate.

Stalling is limited. Stalling will be assigned as entries are received. You may stall from your trailer and will be given parking preference. (see map) You may also bring your own panels and set them up in the llama barn.

Youth Age Divisions Youth age as of Jan. 1, of current year Sub junior - 4 thru 6 yrs Youth Junior *-7 thru 11 yrs. 7 yr olds may show as of their birthday Youth Intermediate - 12 thru 14 yrs

Youth Senior – 15 thru 19 yrs.**

^{*}Juniors may not show intact male llamas age 18 months or older

^{**} When a senior youth reaches their 20th birthday before the show they are no longer eligible to show in the youth division at all

Halter Classes: Animal's age as of the first day of the show

Juvenile – 5 months through 12 months

Yearling – 12 months through 24 months

Two Year Old – 24 months through 36 months

Adult - 36 months and older

Llama wool description and group classes Please enter your llamas in the appropriate wool divisions as outlined below. No wool class changes made at the show except by the judges

- a. Suri Lustrous, cool hand, lack of crimp and minimal loft, locked fiber that drapes over the llama's body.
- b. Silky Very soft or silky handle, may be straight or have some wave or crinkle but not crimp
- Classic Abundant guard hair visible on the body and neck of the animal, with short and minimal "downy" undercoat, Minimal Fleece on legs/head
- d. Light Minimal body wool, short neck wool with smooth legs.
- e. .Medium Moderate to long body wool, minimal to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate and leg wool.
- f. Heavy Abundant body and neck wool with minimal to abundant leg wool. (leg wool at least to knee and hock).

Produce of Dam – Two offspring by the same dam, either sex, and produce may represent the same sire. Produce must be shown in appropriate halter class.

Get-of-Sire – Three offspring by the same sire, either sex, by at least two different dams. All "Get" must be shown in appropriate halter class.

If you do not own the dam or sire, bring written permission from the owner for you to show in "Produce-of-Dam" or "Get-of-Sire"

Performance Classes: Handlers may enter five animals. An animal can only go through a course one time, Youth, Novice, Advanced or Master. Youth may exhibit only one entry per youth class. To qualify for Youth Performance Champion, the youth must show in Obstacle, PR, and Pack and MUST USE THE SAME ANIMAL in all three classes. Youth must show a different animal if entering Novice, Advanced, or Master classes.

Two rings will be running simultaneously. Halter ring takes precedence. Please be attentive to the show ring and have someone help you if necessary. No class will be held up waiting for exhibitors.

<u>All Ilamas should be UNGROOMED!</u> If your llama appears to have been groomed, the Llama Hillbilly Police will not allow entry into the ring. We want this to be a <u>true</u> Hillbilly Hobo Show and we will enforce this rule. No refunds will be made at the show.

BONUS EVENTS

<u>GRAND CHAMPION SHOWMANSHIP</u> will be determined by a champion showmanship class with the 1st place winners from the Adult, Junior, Intermediate, and Senior divisions participating.

<u>GRAND CHAMPION PERFORMANCE</u> will be determined by an additional champion obstacle class with the Performance Champions from the Adv., Novice, Junior, Intermediate, and Senior division competing
