HOLY GOVERNANCE: STEWARDING LAND & PEOPLE

The Earth Belongs to the Lord

Stewardship is Covenant, Not Control

In the beginning, God entrusted land and people into the care of those made in His image. This was not ownership by conquest, but stewardship by covenant. Holy governance is not about domination, taxation, or control — it is the co-creative care of what God has placed in our hands, ensuring that the land remains fruitful and the people flourish in righteousness and peace.

Today, governance has been distorted into power structures that strip people from the land, suppress the voice of the righteous, and replace

Kingdom stewardship with systems of exploitation. This scroll restores God's original blueprint for holy governance — where land is healed, people are shepherded in love, and Christ's authority brings justice without corruption.

What Was Distorted

- Governance shifted from God's delegated stewardship to man's self-serving empires.
- Land became a commodity instead of a sacred trust, leading to displacement and exploitation.

- Policies and systems were designed to benefit a few at the cost of the many, suppressing the poor and the righteous.

What Was Lost

- The understanding that land and people belong to God first, not human governments or corporations.
- The role of leaders as shepherds accountable to the Chief Shepherd, Jesus Christ.

What Must Be Restored

- The confidence to declare God's will publicly without fear of man.

- The culture of covenant-keeping in promises and vows.

What Must Be Restored

partnered with His Spirit:

1. **Sanctify the Mouth** — Yield every word to the Holy Spirit, speaking only what builds, blesses, or aligns with truth.
