




Preserving the rich history of Jewish life and culture in the Lower Midwest

The Riverlands Jewish Archive will be the first completely digital archive dedicated to the history of the Jewish communities along two of America's most important rivers: The Ohio and the Mississippi. We are gathering, scanning, and uploading historical materials from current and former Jewish communities from Cape Girardeau, Missouri to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and north to Terre Haute, Indiana. We are a collaboration between local Jewish communities and wonderful archival organizations such as the Indiana Jewish Historical Society, Western Kentucky University Special Collections, housed within and maintained by the WKU Department of History.
