Extended abstracts should be no more than 2 pages in length, or between 800 and 1,200 words, excluding references. Authors are required to use the provided MS Word or LaTeX templates available on the symposium website. Submissions must be uploaded via the EasyChair system, with the link accessible on the symposium website.
