Another Hidden Tax

Did you know another toll increase is being proposed for the New Hope-Lambertville Bridge?

The commission's Pennsylvania and New Jersey Commissioners unanimously authorized staff to initiate a public hearing process this fall that will follow the formal advertisement of proposed toll schedule changes on the commission's website.

Under the proposed adjustments, the E-ZPass rate for Class 1 passenger vehicles (two axles and under eight feet high) would <u>increase by 50 cents to \$2</u>. The corresponding Toll-By-Plate rate for the same vehicle without E-ZPass would <u>rise by \$2 to \$5</u>.

Toll rates just increased in January 2024 from \$1 to \$1.50 for Class 1 passenger vehicles using E-ZPass. (Prior to that, tolls had increase from \$0.85 to \$1 in January 2021. And prior to that, the last increase was in April 2011 when they increased from \$0.75 to \$0.85.)

The adjustment, they claim, is aimed at offsetting rising construction costs, maintaining the agency's bond rating, and continuing infrastructure investment along its network of bridges connecting New Jersey and Pennsylvania. Of course! Costs are rising everywhere, all the time. But we also see completely unnecessary construction removing the toll plaza on our local bridge, citing that it will reduce traffic. Did anyone encounter traffic when they were crossing from Lambertville to New Hope via the toll bridge prior to the construction starting?

Under the commission's toll-setting policy, a public comment period with three virtual hearings must be scheduled for any proposed toll schedule changes. Comments will also be accepted online, via U.S. Mail, and through a recorded phone line.

All eligible comments will be compiled into a report with responses from staff and presented to commissioners before a final decision is made on the potential toll adjustments.

We will keep you posted on when the public comment period begins.



New Hope Solebury School District Update

The New Hope Solebury School District passed the 2025-2026 budget at the June 2025 Board Meeting, saddling the Solebury Township and New Hope Boro residents with a 4% tax increase. Even with that burden placed on the tax paying residents, the passed budget includes \$2.8 MILLION more in expenses than the revenue it will take in.



And as a reminder, an article in <u>Bucksco.Today</u> pointed out that the New Hope Solebury School District tops the whole state of Pennsylvannia with an average teacher salary of \$111,968. (For context, in PA, the average teacher salary was \$74,945 last year, ranking 11th nationwide.)

<u>Park Mobile Update</u>: The last large free parking lot in New Hope Borough is gone. Working with New Hope Borough, the New Hope-Solebury School District will now charge for parking during high demand hours, including evenings and weekends, at the high school lot.

Parking tickets will be given to those who do not pay for parking at the school.

The mobile parking app system will be turned off during school hours and for school events, including football games and plays.

The parking payment will only be active during high traffic times, such as the Christmas season, summer and weekends. You know, when you actually want and need to park there.

On the plus side, while the Board was originally intending to use the funds gained from fleecing the residents, workers and tourists to compensate for the budget shortfalls, it may make you feel better when forking over the money to know that it will be distributed to the school's sports teams and various clubs to offset their expenses as the proceeds collected by students on-site previously did.
